Prepare the Way of the Lord

From the Pastor's desk

The Gospel of Matthew begins by introducing Jesus as the Son of David, the long-awaited King. While many people at that time expected a king who would defeat their physical enemies and free them from political oppression, God had a much bigger plan. Instead of a worldly victory, Jesus came to save people from their true enemies: sin and death. This shows us that God's ways are much higher than human ways. He chose to solve the root cause of our suffering rather than just fixing our outward problems.

The gospel calls Jesus "Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." This tells us that God did not just watch us from a distance; He actually became a human being to live among us. By doing this, He chose to experience everything we feel—including our struggles, temptations, and pain—yet He remained without sin. Because Jesus lived a human life and even suffered death, we can be sure that He understands our problems perfectly. This is the ultimate proof of how much God truly cares for every one of us.

Finally, we see how God works through people like Joseph. Joseph was a good man who faced a very difficult situation when he learned Mary was pregnant. Though he planned to leave her quietly, God sent an angel to guide him and show him the truth. This story proves that God intervenes in our lives to help His plans succeed. He invites us to be His partners in bringing hope to the world. We should ask ourselves if we are willing to be used by God, just like Joseph was, to help carry out His will.

The Solemnity of the Epiphany will fall on January 4th in 2026.

Epiphany Blessing of the Home-Jan 4th "The first Epiphany was the visit of the Magi to adore the Christ Child.

Marking doorways with chalk is a witness of faith. Use the chalk to mark above the main door, and over all exterior doors.

(20+C+M+B+26)

- Numerals to consecrate the New Year 2026
- Initials to remind us of the Magi names-Caspar, Melchoir and Balthasar, and to represent the Latin motto: Christus Mansionem benedicat (May Christ bless this house.)
- Four crosses to represent the four seasons.
