

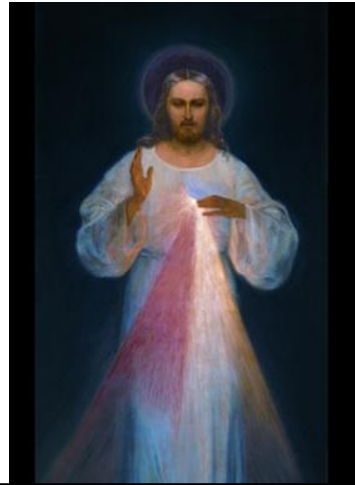

***From the Pastor's Desk***

We love to admire things that look strong—like beautiful buildings, steady routines, or good relationships. They make us feel safe. But Jesus reminds us gently that these things will not always last. When the world feels shaky, when the news is scary, when friendships break, or when the things we depend on start to fail, it can be terrifying. But Jesus makes a clear promise: when these things happen, He stays right beside us.

Today's Gospel reading is not meant to scare us; it is a promise we can hold onto. Jesus does not just talk about hard times; He gives us what we need to get through them. He promises to give us the right words when we do not know what to say, wisdom when we feel lost, and His presence when we feel hurt. He also gives us peace that knows our souls are safe with Him. When Jesus says, "Not a hair of your head will perish," He is telling us that even when life is tough, God holds every single part of us. Nothing you go through is useless, and nothing is hidden from Him.

When we get through these difficult times—not by forcing ourselves, but by having quiet, sure trust in God—we get something that lasts forever. We gain a life that no trouble can take away. Jesus is our solid ground in a world that keeps changing. If something you rely on is starting to shake, bring it to Jesus; He is your only lasting foundation. If you are afraid, ask for His peace, which comes only from being close to Him. By keeping your faith strong, you will truly gain life.

**Holidays are approaching and this can cause many people to have holiday loneliness.** The U.S. census estimates that as many as 27% of adults age 65+ live alone. Loneliness increases the risk of developing depression and anxiety. How can this be prevented?

1. **Make communication a priority .** Reach out to those that are alone so they know they have not been forgotten. Encourage other family members or friends to also call or stop in.
2. **Try to engage in social activities.** Take someone to church that might not have a ride. Offer to take them to the grocery store or Christmas shopping. Help them prepare their Christmas cards. Keep them involved.
3. **Explore a hobby or areas of interest.** Do they like to read? If so, bring them new books, or teach them to crochet and get them yarn. Keep their minds busy.

When you need someone to talk to, you can call **988** Lifeline. It's a free, confidential support line. Counselors are available for issues such as substance abuse, depression and loneliness. *(From Office for Social Concerns)*

This important bipartisan legislation establishes a duty of care for big tech platforms, requiring social media platforms to prevent harms to children.
