From the Pastor's Desk

As we begin Ordinary Time, we are reminded that our lives have a divine purpose. Like the prophet Isaiah, each of us has been formed by God and called to be a light to all nations. This season is a time of commissioning, where we are invited to open our ears to God's Word and our hearts to His values. By nurturing His Word deep within us, we find the strength to "unstop our lips" and share the story of God's goodness with everyone we meet.

In the Gospel, John the Baptist introduces us to Jesus using powerful names: the Lamb of God, the one on whom the Spirit remains, and the Son of God. These titles remind us that Jesus is both strong and vulnerable, filled with the Holy Spirit, and ready to heal and forgive. As His disciples, we share in that same Spirit through our Baptism. We are called to continue His work today—combating violence, hunger, and injustice by being instruments of His mercy and kindness in a world that still deeply needs His touch.

Our journey of faith grows when we personally answer the question: "Who do you say that I am?" Beyond His formal titles, Jesus is our Infinite Love, our True Peace, and our Perfect Empathy. He is the "self-forgetting rescuer" who restores our innocence and guides us home. This week, I invite you to reflect on which image of Jesus moves your heart the most. By naming Him clearly in our own lives, we can follow Him with greater sight and join fully in His mission of love.


We will have a collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD)

### **In light of recent events, please see this letter written by the Bishops of Wisconsin:**

We, the bishops of Wisconsin, reaffirm the recent special message by the United States bishops regarding ongoing federal immigration enforcement. Immigration is a profoundly complex issue. On the one hand, the Catholic Church naturally upholds a country's right to maintain its borders and regulate its entry and citizenship processes. We saw the chaos that ensued when the previous administration was not vigilant in its regulation of the United States' southern border. On the other hand, the Catholic Church urges countries and peoples to compassionately assist our brothers and sisters who emigrate because of war, violence, poverty, and hunger. We can embrace these two principles in unity. There is no inherent contradiction in upholding human dignity, the common good, and the rule of law.

We must acknowledge that the recent federal immigration enforcement has achieved some beneficial outcomes—violent criminals and drug dealers have been deported, and child trafficking rings have been discovered and broken up. No one would disagree that these achievements are just and necessary. But even good goals must be achieved in a way that is just, prudent, and proportionate.

We must also voice our strong concern regarding the indiscriminate nature of the current federal immigration enforcement. U.S. citizens are being racially profiled. Immigrants are vilified, denied pastoral care, detained in poor conditions, and parents and children are being separated. Immigrants who abided by all the rules of the legal immigration process have lost their legal status arbitrarily.

We see this dynamic especially in the experience of those who sought and received political asylum in the USA.

We urge our national leaders to fix our profoundly broken immigration system. This needed legislation must be an urgent priority and would help resolve much of the current crisis. We also urge an equitable and humane enforcement of federal immigration laws and processes, respecting human dignity and the importance of compassion.
