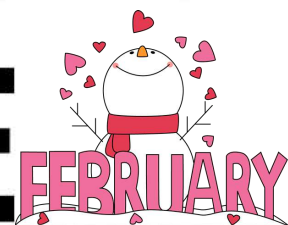

COUNCIL CONNECTION

There are many reasons for a pastor to leave a congregation retirement, another call, or personal reasons. No matter the reason, there will be a period of adjustment for the congregation. Some members of the congregation might feel sad, abandoned, or betrayed, while others might feel relief or even joy at a pastor's departure. From all places on the emotional spectrum there will be some who want to move ahead quickly, often ignoring the emotional work that is critical in transition time. Congregation members must be allowed to process their feelings in order to prepare for the next pastor. Processing emotions takes time and should not be minimized. Transitions are an opportunity to develop new ways of being, of going deeper in discussions about what it means to be a congregation, of taking time to consider how ministry and the church might be changing, of considering what the

future might hold for your congregation.

This statement was taken from "When Your Pastor Leaves: a guide for congregational councils" which was provided to us by the synod. Most of your council members remember when Pastor Olsen retired and the process we went through in calling Pastor Gabi, but not as council members. We have had our first Zoom meeting with the bishop's representative who outlined the synod's guidelines for the process of transitioning from a fulltime pastor to an interim pastor and then calling a pastor. Nancy will be supplying us with supply pastors until we select an interim/transitional pastor which may take a while. We will be appointing a transition committee and a call committee, which may be the same individuals. We were told to expect the process to take about a year, but it could be less or possibly more. If I remember

correctly, I believe Pastor Cindy was with us about two years as an interim pastor before we called Pastor Gabi.

Bear with us, we will be following synod guidelines, but we also have several things to consider. Do we want a full time or part time pastor as our interim pastor? Will we consider a recent graduate or retired pastor? And I am sure there will be more questions coming before us.

We as your church council want to be transparent during this process and this transparency needs to go both ways. If

you have ideas or suggestions, let a council member know. Your input is valuable to us.

Let's us all work together to make this process proceed as smoothly as possible.

We also want to thank Pastor Gabi for her service to the Advent family and wish her the best on her new adventure with a new congregation.

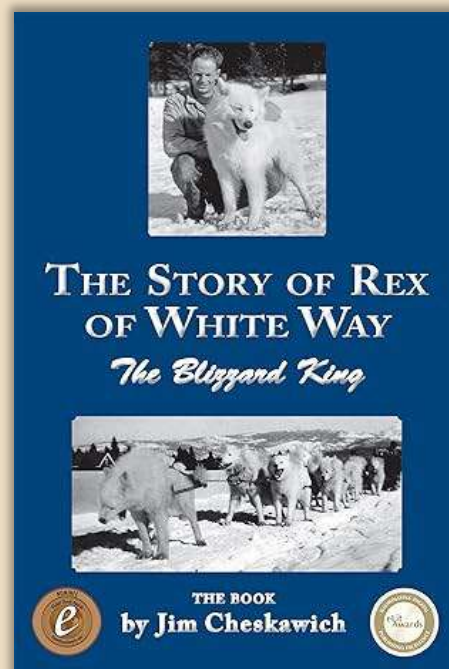

Thank you for your response to the call for volunteers to assist Holy Family during the first week of Winter Sanctuary this year. Although we didn't have a large number of guests, we had plenty of good food and were able to provide what the guests needed to stay safe and warm.

Winter Sanctuary is now beginning its fifth week and we still have not reached our maximum capacity of 20 guests. While that is disappointing, we have been able to provide the guests with regular contact with the navigators who help them access services that are available to them including housing. They are able to shower regularly, get laundry done twice a week, have medical attention including immunizations, attend NA and AA meetings and receive a warm personal welcome each night when they arrive. Barbara and Amy are each volunteering two nights each week at the intake at Messiah Lutheran Church and getting to recognize the names and faces of guests whom we might later encounter on the street.

Please continue to keep the volunteers and guests in your prayers. If you wish to donate funds, place it in an offering envelope designated for "Winter Sanctuary".

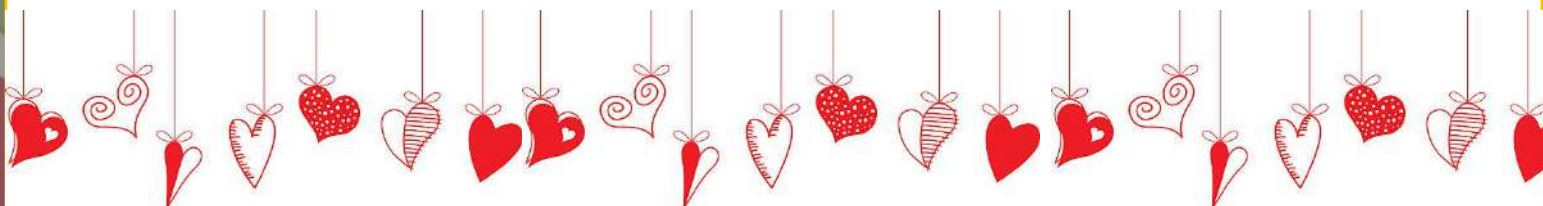

SCFM WINTER REPORT 2026



We are grateful to share the impact your generosity made in 2025. During the holidays and the government shutdown, the demand for food assistance reached unprecedented levels.

When we asked for help, you responded abundantly. Thanks to food drives hosted by local businesses, schools, churches, neighborhood associations, and service organizations, as well as generous individual donations, we were able to meet holiday needs and begin the new year with well-stocked shelves.

In 2025, Sunrise Christian Food Ministry served 29,863 households, reaching 85,885 individuals. We are especially proud of our work supporting seniors and individuals experiencing homelessness. Through our senior hour, home deliveries, and offsite distributions, we served 4,150 seniors, while our daily snack bag program provided 557 homeless neighbors with food and a welcoming place to connect.

Altogether, the ministry distributed 1.8 million pounds of recovered food from partner stores and 500,000 pounds of fresh produce and canned goods from the Federal Government and Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services. We give thanks to God for His faithfulness in providing both the food and the volunteers needed to serve our community (150+ volunteers monthly, serving 15,300 hours in 2025).

We are also grateful for grant-funded support from the City of Citrus Heights, Republic Services, Dutch Bros, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, SMUD, Sacramento County, Abound Food, Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services, PG&E, Cricket Wireless, and many faith-based, business, and civic partners. This support allowed us to increase service capacity, improve infrastructure, and continue our partnership with Advent Lutheran Church through a 10-year lease agreement extending through 2035.

Thank you for being faithful supporters of this ministry. As we begin 2026, we ask for your continued prayers for financial resources, donations for our homeless pantry, and strength and good health for our volunteers as they serve as the hands and feet of Jesus.

Congregations need to submit still more forms to the Lutheran Church in Rwanda Office and then to the Rwanda Governance Board, and hope to eventually obtain accreditation, allowing them to return to worship in their churches (as opposed to homes, as shown in the picture on the right). Please keep our Rwandan brothers and sisters in Christ in your prayers as they navigate this process.
