GHOST RANCH PREACHING WORKSHOP

On July 11, I will be flying to Albuquerque, renting a car, and driving to the little town of Abiquiu, located about 65 miles Northwest of Santa Fe. From there, I will drive another 14 miles to Ghost Ranch, a 21,000 -acre (!) property, located at an elevation of 6,500 feet and which often serves as a location for movie production.

Don't ask me how this is possible, but 200 million years ago Ghost Ranch and the American Southwest were located close to the equator, and had a warm, monsoon-like climate with heavy seasonal precipitation. For that reason, Ghost Ranch is also known for a remarkable concentration of Triassic dinosaur fossils, 1,000s of which have been preserved in a local quarry.

In the later 20th century, Ghost Ranch was the summer home and studio of artist Georgia O'Keeffe, as well as the subject of many of her paintings. Since 1955, Ghost Ranch has been owned by the Presbyterian Church (USA).

I will be attending a 5-day preaching workshop,

- 2. Ernie and I never click on a link in a text or email no matter how genuine it seems. Instead, we log onto the company site to see if there is a problem with our account. It is getting very hard to distinguish fake emails.

We certainly don't want to live in a world that fears technology. To help us learn how to be wise, but not afraid, we are looking forward to learning more in an upcoming class about scams and scammers. 

RWANDA—ADVENT COMPANION RELATIONSHIP

Over the years, Advent has built a relationship with both Matimba Parish and its pastor, Rev. Twesige George. This dual relationship changed a bit in 2024, when the leadership of the Lutheran Church of Rwanda (LCR) moved Pr. George to a different parish (Nyagashanga Parish). The official reason given was that while Pr. George excelled at faith, worship, and pastoral care, he was lacking as far as formal theological training and management skills (in terms of both property and parish school).

Due to new government requirements, all faith-based organizations have to prove that they meet certain minimum government standards in terms of the leaders' professional education and their facilities, if they want to keep their official government registration. The LCR determined that they had neither sufficient leaders that met those standards, nor did all of their church facilities meet the government-mandated minimum standards. As a solution, they combined parishes into larger units and invested funds into building floors, roofs, and toilet facilities.

In September 2024, a new pastor who had received his theological education at seminary in Tanzania was sent to Matimba Parish – Pastor Musafiri Jackson (ordained in 2017). Pastor Twesige George, in turn, was sent to a much smaller congregation – Nyagashanga. That congregation has only few members and a much smaller, yet unfinished building.

For Pastor George, this meant that he would have to continue living with his wife Sylvia and daughter Patience in Matimba, but travel a few days each week to Nyagashanga. This came with additional expenses, but not necessarily with

income, for Nyagashanga had no companion parish relationship with any Sierra Pacific Synod (SPS) congregation.

Many Rwandan congregation cannot afford paying their pastors a living wage (around \$100 per month in rural settings). Those pastors whose parishes receive support from a SPS congregation, typically use those funds to pay their pastor.

Until this Spring Advent has budgeted \$2,000 annually (or \$125 per month) to send to Matimba via ELCA Global Missions. ELCA then would bundle everyone's funds into one payment that was sent to the leaders of the Lutheran Church of Rwanda. The LCR then was to distribute those funds to the congregations for which the funds were intended. Both ELCA and LCR deducted a portion of those funds to cover their administrative expenses. It is not clear whether Matimba received all funds that we sent (minus the overhead deductions). The one thing we know is that the LCR released funds and bought a motorbike to be used by Pastor George.

Advent's Church Council recently voted to bypass both ELCA Global Missions and the national Rwandan church body and send funds directly to the parish via Western Union, which has a representative in Matimba). The Council also voted to increase our monthly payment to \$200 and divide that Amount between Matimba and Nyagashanga Parishes.

The exact details are yet to be worked out between our treasurer, bookkeeper, and SAFE Credit Union. Once that happens, we will celebrate our increased relationship with Lutherans in Rwanda.


days.
