We Are Gathered Here **Week 4: Gather for Unity**

Key Scriptures:

Psalm 133 • Matthew 18:20

Why Unity Matters

When we gather in the name of Jesus, we are never gathering alone. Christ Himself is present when even two or three come together in His name. Unity does not depend on numbers — it depends on who we gather around.

Unity in Christ

We share many things as a church: faith, hope, love, fellowship, prayer, teaching, and communion. But above all, we share Jesus. When we unify ourselves under His authority, His presence ignites what isolation cannot. Alone we flicker — together in Christ, we burn brightly.

Unity Is Blessed

Psalm 133 reminds us that unity is “good and pleasant” and that God commands His blessing where His people live in harmony. Like oil poured out, blessing flows freely when unity is present. Disunity blocks the flow, but unity creates space for God to move.

When We Feel Divided

Division happens — but unity can be restored through humility and forgiveness. Unforgiveness weighs us down, while forgiveness opens the door to healing and reconciliation. As far as it depends on us, we are called to live at peace with one another.

We Are One

We are one body, one Spirit, one hope, one Lord. Unity does not erase our differences — it redeems them for God's greater purpose. When one part of the body hurts, we all feel it. When one part is missing, the whole body is affected.
