

Week 3: Gather for Strength

BIG IDEA:

We are stronger together than we are apart. God designed His church to find strength, protection, and purpose through shared life and shared faith.

● Stronger Together Brings a Greater Harvest

Proverbs 14:4

Scripture reminds us that where there are no oxen, the manger may be clean—but there is no harvest. Community can be messy. Relationships take effort. God uses imperfect people, working together, to accomplish extraordinary things for His kingdom.

● Stronger Together Provides Greater Protection

1 Peter 5:8

The enemy looks for those who are isolated, discouraged, and alone—easy targets for attack. Fellowship provides encouragement, accountability, and spiritual protection. We are safer when we stay connected.

● Stronger Together Means Shared Strength

Ecclesiastes 4:12
