AN ATTITUDE OF GRATITUDE

Luke 17:11–19

I. THE POSITION OF ALL

1. They Were in an Awful Position

- The lepers stood “afar off”—isolated from family, friends, worship, and God.
- Their separation pictures the spiritual distance caused by sin.
- The Law kept them away; sin still keeps people far from God.

2. They Were in an Approachable Position

- Where the Law prohibits, Jesus steps in.
- They could not come to Him, so **He came to them**.
- All sinners share this helpless position, but Christ draws near.

II. THE PRAYER OF ALL

1. Their Observation

- They recognized their need and cried, “*Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!*”
- No one seeks Christ until they sense their need for Him.

2. Their Obedience

- Jesus told them to show themselves to the priest.
- They obeyed **before** they were healed.
- Obedience opens the door for God's work.

III. THE PRAISE OF ONE

1. The Opportunity of Praise

- One saw he was healed—and turned back.
- Many pray for blessings—few return to praise God.
- All had reason to praise, but only one recognized it.

2. The Object of Praise

- The others returned to the blessings—only one returned to the **Blesser**.
- He received more than physical healing; he found spiritual

Conclusion

Like the one thankful leper, let us pause, return, and give thanks—for all God has done, all He is doing, and all He will do. A grateful heart leads to deeper worship and greater closeness with Christ.
