The Williamson County Animal Center's Paw Pantry provides FREE pet food to Williamson County residents in an effort to promote pet retention and reduce surrenders to the shelter. Food for the program is donated and supplies are limited. This program now takes place twice a month in Williamson County and has become very popular! Currently they need help keeping the Paw Pantry stocked. The biggest need as of right now is dry cat food, but we will also collect dry dog, puppy, and kitten food.

HOW OUR "PAWS-IT-FORWARD" PROGRAM WORKS

Our customers who donate at least \$10 in pet food will receive 10% of ANY repair or service (excluding oil changes) up to \$100 during the month of March. In addition, we will sponsor any adult dog or cat pet adoption from Williamson County Animal Center by our customers during the month. We are also personally sponsoring 5 pet adoptions at WCAC this month for longer term pets.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU, WCAC, THE PAW PANTRY AND PETS IN NEED?

- You will receive 10% of any Repair or Service up to \$100 (excluding oil changes).
- The WCAC Paw Pantry will be stocked with your pet food donations.
- The community and their pets in need will be able to get fed, promoting pet retention and reduce surrenders.
- If you adopt an adult dog or cat this month, Heavensent Automotive will pay for your adoption.

How to Prepare Your Vehicle for Your Spring Break Road Trip

It's important to do what you can to help ensure that your spring break road trip is breakdown-free and goes as smoothly as possible. A vehicle check-up and some basic car maintenance services before your trip can prevent a disaster or emergency from happening. There are certain systems in your vehicle that you should definitely have checked out before leaving. These 6 tips will help you to have a safe trip, without any unwanted adventures involving a vehicle breakdown.

1. Take Your Car for an Oil Change

Oil changes are some of the simplest yet most effective forms of maintenance out there. Keep your car running strong with a complete oil and fluid change and maintenance check. Be sure to do this a few weeks before you plan to leave on your trip, so your mechanic can fix any small issues they may find.

2: Check the Battery

Your vehicle's battery should be fully charged and able to sustain you while on the road. Always make sure your vehicle's battery is charged and able to hold during long trips on the road.

3: Keep Your Tires Rolling

Flat tires are one of the most common reasons for a breakdown on a road trip. Before you leave, check the amount of air in each of your tires, making sure they are full and are able to hold without going flat. You also want to check the gauge of the tire treads, making sure they are 3/4 inches and with strong traction. Rotating or changing tires before you leave can help you to avoid unnecessary breakdowns. Making sure any spare tires are in good condition is a smart idea too.

4: Check Vehicle Fluid Levels

Making sure all your vehicle's fluids are filled and in top condition is critical. Engine oil should be at a full level before you leave for a trip. Also be sure to check the transmission fluid levels, wiper fluid and antifreeze as well. Checking each of these essential fluids equates to a safer trip.


5: Make Sure You Check Your Brakes!

Faulty brakes can lead to dangerous situations, especially during longer trips. Checking the brake pressure in your vehicle is an essential car maintenance item. This includes measuring your brake pressure, as well as brake fluid in the car, all of which will make your trip easier when going and stopping.

6: Check Electrical Equipment & Lighting Function

It is sometimes the smaller elements of a vehicle that can lead to problems while on the road. Your vehicle's maintenance should also include the checking of all your car's electrical equipment. Your windshield wipers, windows, turn signals, headlights and brake lights should all be in top order and easy to use. If you have a GPS or other connected devices, then you will want to include this in the inspection as well.
