





DIY SALT DOUGH ORNAMENTS


WHAT YOU'LL NEED:


- 1 cup flour
- 1/2 cup salt
- 1/2 cup water

WHAT YOU'LL DO:

- 1. Mix the flour, salt, and water together until you have a smooth dough.
- 2. Roll it out about 1/4 inch thick. Use cookie cutters to cut out festive shapes like stars, trees, or bells. Don't forget to poke a small hole near the top for hanging!
- 3. Place the shapes on a baking sheet and bake at 250°F for 2-3 hours until hard and dry.
- 4. Once cool, decorate with paint, markers, or glitter, then thread a ribbon or string through the hole and hang on the tree!
