












Dear Friends,

Throughout his three-year public ministry the Lord exercised a ministry of healing. Precisely twenty-six particular healings are detailed in the four Gospels, though certainly He performed even more than these. Miraculous healings of the body (blindness, paralysis, deformities, etc.) witness to the even greater feat of soul-healings. Today's readings highlight the healing graces that Jesus brings.

The Lord ultimately wants to heal us at the level of our souls: to heal us of pride, jealousy, selfishness, unrighteous anger, unforgiveness, lust, greed, dishonesty, and every kind of sin. Recognize that all sin is a form of "soul sickness" and believe in the Lord's power and desire to heal you. The Sacrament of Confession is his most ordinary "prescription" as the Physician of our souls.

Also recognize that the Lord continues to accomplish physical healings in the present age. His power over nature and the human body was not limited to his three-year ministry two thousand years ago. Just recently I visited a woman in the hospital who was at death's door, and now she is at home after having "bounced back" from her serious illness to a more stable condition. In addition to anointing her during the visit, I prayed with her (and family and friends gathered around her

hospital bed) using the "Prayer of Saint Padre Pio for Health." (See page 20 in the St. Louis Parish Prayer Booklet.). The woman showed great faith and her faith was visibly rewarded with a physical strengthening, literally lengthening her life on earth as she continues to carry the cross of a terminal illness.

Believe in the Lord's power and mercy by praying with people and for people in their need for physical healing. Use especially the beautiful prayer of Saint Padre Pio.

And most importantly realize that your faith in the Lord's power to heal physically on earth is ultimately a declaration of your faith that he can heal you - and others - at the level of the soul. "Soul healing" is ultimately why our Lord came.

P.S. Please know that we, your priests, rely on you to let us know when a person is in need of sacramental care (whether at home or in the hospital). Priestly ministry is strongly dedicated to the care of the sick and homebound, so please do your part by keeping us informed of anyone (neighbor, family, friend) who would benefit from a visit, especially to receive the Sacraments of Anointing, Confession, and Holy Communion.





Participants in Promoting the Common Good

September 2025

As Virginia voters, this fall we will elect our next Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General. We will also decide who will occupy all 100 Virginia House of Delegates seats. Election Day is November 4. Early voting begins September 19.

As the Catechism reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good.... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).

To promote the common good, we must form our consciences and vote, recognizing that:

- Many issues are important.
- Not all issues have equal moral weight.
- Protecting life is paramount.

Above all else, addressing the tragedy of abortion is the "pre-eminent priority because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone' (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, Introductory Note, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2023).

The Virginia Catholic Conference (VCC) has prepared an array of voter education resources to help form consciences and provide timely information. Visit www.vacatholic.org/Election2025 to view these materials

We encourage parishes to distribute each of the VCC resources, especially:

- The VCC's Candidate Comparisons in the races for Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General, which provide the candidates' positions on key issues; and
- The Proposed Constitutional Amendments: Be Vigilant! resource, which explains three proposed
 amendments to Virginia's constitution. These proposals have already moved part of the way through the
 General Assembly process. One of them would allow virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of
 pregnancy. The legislators we elect in the House races this November will decide whether these proposed
 constitutional amendments advance any further.

With so much at stake, we must prepare to engage in this year's critical voting decisions – through conscience formation, prayer and fasting. United in the Eucharist, let us pray for one another and join together as active participants in promoting the common good.
