Dear Friends,

One of my most formative experiences growing up was playing sports. I was blessed that my parents provided the opportunity for me (and my siblings) to play soccer and basketball. I learned teamwork, perseverance, self-confidence, and how to deal with adversity. You win some, you lose some; that's life and you move on.

To this day I can still recall the voices of encouragement in the persons of my coaches: Coach Huff, Coach Nakhid, Coach O'Connor, Coach Elias, Coach Jackson, and others. I recall their names but most of all I recall their example of dedication and love. (My Dad was also my basketball coach for a few years.) I know full well that these men helped to shape me in my youth into the man and priest that I would eventually become. In my college years I had the opportunity myself to be a youth soccer coach and did my best to pass on what I had received.

The word "coach" has a meaningful history. From the French "coche" in the 1550's it meant a "four-wheeled covered carriage." By the 1800's it had evolved to mean the tutor who helped (carry) a student to pass an exam. That meaning further evolved to its modern usage. A sports coach does indeed help his players (students) to pass the "exam" of life. Through sports the players learn not only how to play a particular sport and compete, but even more how to develop the virtues that will help them be the best version of themselves for the rest of their lives.

I sincerely commend all of you who are coaches! You dedicate so much time and effort to the youth and you have an immense impact on their lives. I simply ask you to remember this: perhaps the single clearest sign that a coach has fulfilled his/her mission is NOT the win-loss record at the end of a season, but rather the much more enduring record inscribed in each of the player's hearts: that is, that each player possesses a greater sense of worth and self-confidence than was possessed before the season began.

May your faith give you strength to live this vocation well!



Proposed Constitutional Amendments: Be Vigilant!



Proposed Amendments to Virginia's Constitution would:



Create a radical "fundamental right" to abortion

(Opposed by VCC)



Restore voting rights (Supported by VCC)



Remove Virginia's "union between one man and one woman" definition of marriage (Opposed by VCC)

These three proposals were **initially approved** by the General Assembly earlier this year. If they pass the legislature again in 2026 – and are then approved by Virginia voters on a ballot – they would become law.

The legislators we elect this November will decide whether the proposed amendments are advanced or stopped.

Extreme, Radical and Deadly Abortion Amendment

This proposed amendment would enshrine virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy as a "fundamental right" in Virginia's constitution.

In addition to the paramount problem of not recognizing the child's life, the amendment:

- Does not include any age restriction
- Does not include any safety standards
- Jeopardizes Virginia's parental consent law
- Jeopardizes Virginia's conscience protections for healthcare providers
- Expands Virginia's already permissive abortion laws
- And has numerous other problems!

Abortion is a fundamental tragedy, not a "fundamental right".

Ending a life is not a right and does not belong in the constitution.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments:





Amendment Rejecting the Truth about Marriage

This proposed amendment would remove Virginia's constitutional definition of marriage as the "union between one man and one woman." It would add language recognizing "any lawful marriage between two adult persons" instead.

Marriage was created by God as the union of a man and a woman. God's design and purpose for marriage existed before any nation, religion or law.

The family – based on marriage between a man and a woman – is the fundamental unit of society and is integral to the common good.

Marriage – as created by God – is essential to the common good. Each of us is called to preserve God's design.



Amendment Restoring Voting Rights

This proposed amendment would restore voting rights to all people who have completed their prison sentences.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate...in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person.... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in *public life*" (nos. 1913-1915).

Enabling individuals, upon release, to resume taking an active part in voting decisions affirms their dignity and provides them a second chance to fulfill their duty to participate in promoting the common good. It enables them to have a say in decisions that affect them, their families and their communities.

As the U.S. Catholic Bishops have noted, restoring voting rights is an important aspect of reintegration:

"[W]e must welcome ex-offenders back into society as full participating members, to the extent feasible, and support their right to vote."

Inspired by the spirit of St. Vincent de Paul, our parish SVdP conference seeks to bring hope and stability to neighbors

in crisis—made possible through your generosity and prayers. Recently, we assisted a neighbor whose careful budget usually covers her expenses but who faced an unexpected challenge when her rental office delayed returning her security deposit. While she waited, we provided rental assistance and a food card to help her stay on track.

SVdP volunteers also visited the home of another neighbor we had helped in the past. After her school contract ended in June, she depleted her savings by August. She has since started a new job in elder care, but with limited hours her income could not cover overdue rent and late fees. Your support enabled us to help her make her September payment and avoid further financial hardship.


