Hymn to Saint Louis

Today the earth with heaven sings, the praises of the King of Kings. For Christ, who governs time and space, gave Louis strength to rule by grace.

Saint Louis held the land in peace; he made the fruits of earth increase. Most brave, when called to go to war, most generous to all the poor.

He taught his family the same: To love and serve God's holy name, To flee from sin, to love the good— The royal road of fatherhood.

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah (58:6-11)

Thus says the Lord: This is the fasting that I wish: releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke; sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppressed and the homeless; clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own.

Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed; your vindication shall go before you, and the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: Here I am!

If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech; if you bestow bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday; then the Lord will guide you always and give you plenty even on the parched land. He will renew your strength, and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring whose water never fails.

Responsorial (Psalm 112): "Blessed the man who fears the Lord."

A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Galatians (6:14-16)

Brothers and sisters: may I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither does circumcision mean anything, nor does uncircumcision, but only a new creation. Peace and mercy be to all who follow this rule and to the Israel of God.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (22:34-40)

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law, tested him by asking: "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?"

He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

He served the needy of the land; he fed them all with his own hand. He took them in and washed their feet, and gave them his own food to eat.

He turned from greed and sinful pride; with prayer each labor sanctified. He feared no evil, nor the sword, but firmly trusted in the Lord.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends.

This weekend we celebrate the life of Saint Louis IX, King of France, the patron saint of our parish. Though his life was relatively short (he died at the age of 56), he lived a heroically virtuous life and accomplished great things in service to God and his fellow man. St. Louis did outstanding work for the poor; he negotiated peace between warring factions; he raised a family with his wife; he went on two Crusades in defense of Christianity; he sponsored the construction of numerous churches and monasteries; he prayed constantly and in particular found inspiration in the spirituality of Saint Francis of Assisi. He lived life to the full!

I think the key to the life of Saint Louis can be found in our Lord's Crown of Thorns. (St. Louis obtained this holy relic from the Holy Land and then built the famous Sainte-Chapelle in Paris to house the relic.)

Louis wore a golden crown as the King of France. But he undoubtedly spent hours contemplating the much more important crown that was placed on our Lord's head during his Sacred Passion. St. Louis believed that the meaning of his life was to be found in the life of Jesus. "Only in the mystery of the Incarnate Word does the mystery of man take on light." (Gaudium et Spes, 22) Look at Jesus today; look at every aspect of his life; connect them with every aspect of your life. It is in Him that your life finds its ultimate meaning and destiny. St. Louis did precisely this and that is what we celebrate today as a parish family.

St. Louis, King of France, pray for us!

We pray for all teachers, students, and their families as they begin a new school year this week!


