# From the New Testament

# Mark 1:1-11 – The Baptism of Jesus (Inclusive Bible)

Here begins the gospel of Jesus Christ, the son of God: As it was written in Isaiah the prophet: "I send my messenger before you to pave your way, a herald's voice in the desert, crying, 'Make ready the way of our God. Clear a straight path.' "

And so John the Baptizer appeared in the desert, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean people and all the people of Jerusalem went out to John and were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair and wore a leather

belt around his waist, and he ate nothing but grasshoppers and wild honey.

In the course of his preaching, John said, "One more powerful than I is to come after me. I am not fit to stoop and untie his sandal straps. I have baptized you in water, but the One to come will baptize you in the Holy Spirit."

It was then that Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan River by John. Immediately upon coming out of the water, Jesus saw the heavens opening and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. Then a voice came from the heavens: "You are my Beloved, my Own. On you my favour rests."
