I'll begin this week's 'What's Happening?' by letting you know that Jack Muma, a (former) very active Westminster member and Church Treasurer, passed away recently. A celebration of his life was held on at Victoria Greenlawn Funeral Home on Wednesday, March 13, 2024.

To make a long story short, in this rather odd biblical text we're told that some 'Greeks' came to 'see' Jesus, and when they finally got to 'see' him, Jesus was totally preoccupied, orating a lengthy soliloquy or monologue about his pending death.

Not the stuff to inspire visiting 'Greeks' for sure; or the creation of an uplifting sermon for this coming Sunday's gathered flock. Nevertheless, I persevered and finally drafted Lenten remarks based on this peculiar New Testament passage. My sermon is titled "We Too Would See Jesus" [Subtitle: 'Jesus; A Man of Integrity']. I look forward to receiving your post-service feedback on this one.

It should be noted too that March 17 is not only St. Patrick's Day and the Fifth Sunday in Lent but also the final Sunday of the Lenten Season. The following Sunday, March 24, we enter what traditional Christians call 'Holy Week', a serious and sombre time set aside for marking and observing the final week of Jesus' life.

Those are my final Lenten thoughts for this issue of 'What's Happening?'

Whether you plan to worship and celebrate in-person or virtually, I look forward to being with you again this coming Sunday.
