This morning we welcome Pastor Nathan Stevenson to the Westminster Pulpit. Nathan and Adrienne Stevenson have been married for 18 years and have two sons: Jaquan, 28, and Steven, 24. Nathan attended Mississippi College in Clinton, MS, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree with an emphasis in Pre-law and a Minor in Psychology.

At 24, in March 1994, Nathan was called to the ministry—a calling he has embraced with unwavering commitment. His service in the church has been marked by a diverse range of outreach and evangelistic efforts, including leading the weekly Elderly Convalescent Home Bible Study, serving as a Chaplain at the Raymond Detention Center in Raymond, MS, and as Chaplain of Piney Woods School of Life in Piney Woods, MS. Nathan's dedication to his pastoral duties is evident in his nine-year tenure as a lead pastor.

May 2023 marked a significant milestone in his spiritual and educational journey when he graduated from Reformed Theological Seminary in Jackson, MS, with a Master of Divinity. Since then, he has transferred his licensure and ordination into the Mississippi Valley Presbytery, and is now embarking on a new chapter of his life as the church planter for the Old Canton Corridor in Jackson, MS.

His vision for this church is to be a thriving, reformed, multiethnic, and multicultural community that will extend hope and support to all who need God's Word—thereby fulfilling God's great commission to advance the kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven.

"Today, God Has Rolled the Reproach Away" *Joshua 5:1-14*

Westminster Devotions (August 4th – 9th)

Six Day Devotional outline leading up to Sunday based on my message "Today, God Has Rolled the Reproach Away" (Joshua 5:1–15). Each day includes a Scripture focus, reflection, and application questions to help internalize the message throughout the week.

Monday: God Goes Before You

Text: Joshua 5:1

Theme: God fights for His people before they fight any battle.

Reflection:

Before Israel lifted a sword in Canaan, the hearts of their enemies melted. Why? Because the Lord had already gone before them. This teaches us that God's grace and power precede our obedience. Before we ever face a battle, God is silently working behind the scenes on our behalf.

Application Questions:

- Where have you seen God go ahead of you in your life?
- What current battle are you trying to fight in your own strength?
- How would it change your mindset to know God is already at work?

Tuesday: A New Beginning Through Baptism

Text: Joshua 5:1; 1 Corinthians 10:1–2

Theme: Baptism marks God's redeeming work and our new identity.

Reflection:

The crossing of the Jordan points to baptism—both for Israel and ultimately for Christ. It symbolizes moving from death to life, from wandering to God's promises. Baptism doesn't save us, but it marks us as belonging to the God who has delivered us from our sins.

Application Questions:

- Have you publicly identified with Christ after your baptism?
- Do you live daily out of the identity God has given you?
- How can you remember your baptism today?

Wednesday: Cutting Away What Doesn't Belong

Text: Joshua 5:2–7; Deuteronomy 10:16

Theme: God desires not just outward signs, but inward obedience.

Reflection:

Circumcision was a physical reminder of God's covenant, but it pointed to a deeper spiritual truth—He wants our hearts. God raised a new generation because the old one hardened theirs. Even now, He's calling us to cut away the rebellion, pride, or apathy that keeps us from full devotion.

Application Questions:

- Is there an area in your heart that needs to be "circumcised"?
- What does obedience look like for you this week?
- What habits or attitudes might God be asking you to cut away?

Thursday: The Reproach Has Been Rolled Away

Text: Joshua 5:8–9

Theme: *Shame from the past does not define God's people.*

Reflection:

For 40 years, Israel carried the weight of disobedience and failure. But at Gilgal, God declared, "Today I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt." The same is true for us in Christ—our shame is no longer our identity.

Application Questions:

- What "reproach" are you still carrying that Christ has already rolled away?
- Do you define yourself by past failures or God's promises?
- How can you live today like you are free?

Friday: A Meal That Reminds Us

Text: Joshua 5:10–12; 1 Corinthians 11

Theme: The Passover (and the Lord's Supper) reminds us of God's saving grace.

Reflection:

The Passover celebrated God's rescue and called His people to remember. The manna

ceased because now they would live off the promises fulfilled. Today, the Lord's Supper is our covenant meal. It points us to Jesus—our true and final deliverance.

Application Questions:

- When you take communion, do you reflect on its depth and meaning?
- How does remembering God's faithfulness change your daily life?
- In what ways can you prepare your heart better before taking the Lord's Supper?

Saturday: God is with Us—Even in the Battle

Text: Joshua 5:13–14

Theme: God doesn't join our plans; He invites us into His.

Reflection:

Joshua meets the Commander of the Lord's army and asks, "Are you for us or for our enemies?" The answer? "No." God isn't taking sides—He is the side. We don't ask God to follow our agenda; we bow to His authority and follow Him.

Application Questions:

- Are you trying to get God on your side, or are you on His?
- What does it look like to fully surrender your plans to God?
- Where do you need to trust His leadership today?
