

## **SECURITY DEBRIEFING**

**Due to a change in status, you are being debriefed from access to classified information.**

**You are reminded that you entered into an obligation to the U.S. Government to protect national security information by signing a Non-Disclosure Agreement. This is a lifetime obligation. Termination of your access to classified information does not terminate your responsibility to protect classified information to which you have had access. Although debriefed from current access, there is need for continued caution and discretion.**

**You have information that makes you a potential target for foreign intelligence services and interests. Report any inappropriate request for national security information immediately to the FBI or this Security Office. Failure to do so is a violation of Title 18, United States Code. The Government relies greatly on your personal integrity and sense of loyalty.**

**Unauthorized disclosure of classified information may constitute a violation of Sections 641, 783(b), 793, 794, 798, 952 and 1924, Title 50 United States Code, a United States criminal law. Because it is sometimes difficult to remember exactly what is classified and what is unclassified, avoid discussing any portion of your work which involved classified information.**

**You must declare at this time that you no longer possess any documents or material containing classified information. All classified material that was in your custody must have been reassigned or returned to your Security Office. Be aware that unauthorized possession of classified material and unauthorized disclosure of classified information is a violation of Title 18, United States Code - a Federal crime punishable up to ten (10) years in prison or a fine of \$10,000.00 or both.**

**You also have a responsibility to submit any material intended for public release -- which you have reason to believe might contain classified material -- for security review prior to release. This means that if you prepare a lecture or write an article which might contain classified information, you should submit the material to your new Security Office, or the last Security Office at which you had access, for security review before you deliver the lecture or submit the article for publication.**
