




# Mary Ellis Class News

The children have been busy showing their continued progress in grammar, maths skills and reading comprehension. What a great start to our "Chance to Shine" week!



Donations of ice ops will be gratefully received.






### Information form the Local Authority

From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be **£80 if paid within 21 days**, or **£160 if paid within 28 days**. This rate is in line with inflation and is the first increase since 2012.

In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160.

Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

If you're prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.
