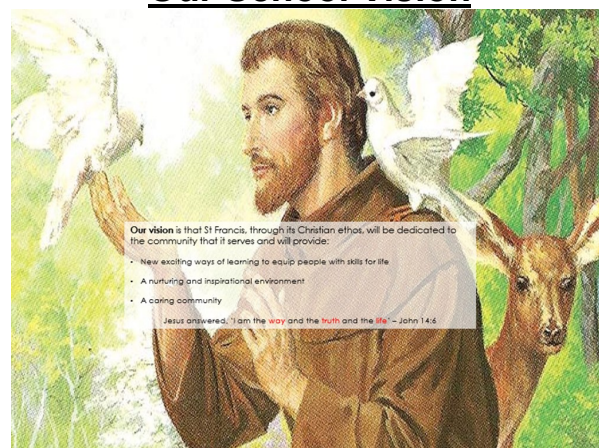

# Malala Yousafzai Class News.

The second week in and Malala class have been busy, and we've had a fantastic week.

We started our new Destination Reader book, 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell. The children have been intrigued by the opening chapters. We are keen to discover how Fred, Con, Lila and Max survive after their plane crash in the Amazon rainforest. As a class we have focussed on the characters personalities and relationships.

In Maths we have been looking at number and place value up to 1,000,000. We have considered how adding to different place value columns alters the overall value of the number, regrouping from one column to another.

The class really enjoyed learning Rugby skills with Mr Marshall. We practiced our throwing and catching the ball, as well as communicating with our team-mates without speaking. We saw whether we could pass the ball round the circle faster than one of the children could run around the circle. Then we played a team game where we had to try to pass the ball to each other, without it going out of play or the other team intercepting it. Finally, we finished off with a game of 'Gladiators' the children needed to run with the ball past their classmates right around the playground. It was great fun.

In History and Science, we started new topics: Dinosaurs and Fossils and Life Cycles respectively. The class considered what they already knew about these topics and we tested our prior knowledge by playing Blooket games. At the end of the topics we'll monitor what we have learnt.

All in all a busy, tiring but very enjoyable week. We're looking forward to lots more together.

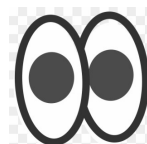

### What Parents & Educators Need to Know about CONSPIRACY THEORIES

Conspiracy theories are false or misleading beliefs that explain events as secret plots, often involving powerful groups. While once fringe, they are now more accessible through digital media, online influencers and because of algorithmic recommendations. The OE guidance document, 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' (KCSIE) explicitly recognises conspiracy theories as potential content risks. This guide will help parents and educators understand the risks, spot the signs, and build children's resilience to conspiracy theories.

**WHAT ARE THE RISKS?**

- UNDERMINING TRUST**  
Conspiracy theories can lead children and young people to distrust democratic institutions and British values, teachers, and even their own families and loved ones. This erosion of trust makes young people more vulnerable to extremist narratives by isolating them from reliable sources of information.
- ONLINE ALGORITHM TRAPS**  
Social media platforms can often recommend inappropriate content. Once a child or young person with one conspiracy-theory-related idea or opinion engages with more of the same, they're creating an echo chamber that can intensify their beliefs.
- MENTAL HEALTH IMPACT**  
Exposure to high-flying conspiracy content, such as global plots, viruses or government control, can fuel feelings of anxiety, paranoia, or hopelessness. For some young people, it can trigger pre-existing or developing mental health issues.
- GATEWAY TO EXTREMISM**  
Conspiracy theories can often overlap with extremist ideologies. Narratives that blame specific groups, such as politicians, scientists, or particular ethnic groups, can groom children in ways that foster hate, bigotry, and radicalisation.
- CONFLICT WITH PEERS**  
Belief in conspiracy theories can lead to isolation or conflict at school. Children may struggle with peer relationships if they express these beliefs or become distressed if others are disagreeable, sometimes, confrontation can even result in it being damaging to the child in the conspiracy theory.
- ERODED CRITICAL THINKING**  
Young people influenced by conspiracies may reject evidence-based learning. This often undermines their academic progress and questioning their ability to think critically, assess risks, or engage in healthy debate.

### Advice for Parents & Educators

**I WANT TO BELIEVE**

- CREATE SAFE CONVERSATIONS**  
Don't mock or dismiss any questions that children and young people ask about conspiracy theories. Instead, create open, judgement-free spaces to talk. This strengthens trust and makes it more likely they will confide in you.
- PROMOTE CRITICAL THINKING**  
Teach young people how to assess information critically. Encourage them to ask exploratory questions, such as 'What's the evidence in here?' 'What do other trusted sources say?' Use real examples from current media to explore your answers and reasoning.
- MONITOR DIGITAL BEHAVIOUR**  
Be aware of the content children are accessing, especially on platforms such as TikTok, YouTube, or Reddit. Use parental controls, but more importantly, maintain ongoing dialogue about online experiences and influences.
- REINFORCE RELIABLE SOURCES**  
Point children toward trustworthy and reliable sources of news and information in a variety of formats tailored to the young person's age. Build habits of verifying from using reliable sources, and teach them how to spot misleading content.
