③ Consider a law establishing funding (subject to the availability of funds) offered to Pro Life organizations to implement a Public Relations Campaign with Public Service Announcements and advertising mediums promoting pro-life policies and adoption rather than abortion.

In effect, this discourages forced abortions by penalizing pimps/traffickers for pushing women, under duress, into abortions when their "sexual acts" for these predators result in pregnancy.




