What is the East Texas Council of Governments?

- Voluntary association of local governments
- Established in 1970
- Assists local governments in planning for common needs
- Serves as the bridge between federal, state, and local governments, helping cities and counties solve challenges and impact the future regionally





Materials Management: Solid Waste Grant Program

- Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) allocates funds generated by landfill tipping fees to the 24 council of governments in the State of Texas
- Portion of this funding at ETCOG is allocated towards local and regional implementation grants
- All COGs required to issue a biennial report to legislature detailing impacts and results of pass-through grants
- Reports Regional Solutions to Local Jurisdictions







\$161,705.00 Available for FY 26-FY 27 Regional Solid Waste Projects

- All funding for these projects is subject to sufficient funds in the Municipal Solid Waste Disposal Account and to the receipt and availability of funds appropriated by the Texas Legislature for the purposes of this call for projects
- In the event funding is not available, ETCOG has no obligation to provide funding to any projects that may be selected in association with this call for projects

- Example: Smith County, Final FY 26 solid waste grant application or Draft review FY 26 solid waste grant application
- Supplies Category Threshold change from less than \$1,000.00 to less than \$10,000.00
- Equipment Category threshold change from \$5,000.00 or more to \$10,000.00 or more



GRANT REQUIREMENTS SET BY TEXAS STATE LEGISLATURE & TCEQ

- Funds to be used 100% for solid waste
- Payments for expenses on <u>reimbursement basis only</u>
- Project expenses must be incurred within grant period & not prior to TCEQ approval, executed grant agreement with ETCOG, and notice to commence email from ETCOG
- Grant funded projects must not create unfair competition with existing private industry
- TxGMS- Each grant recipient is required to follow state and federal procurement regulations and guidelines
- Not allowed to charge citizens for participating in Solid Waste grant funded project events
- Revenues realized from recycling efforts funded through this program must be placed back into the respective solid waste management program, not into a funded entities general revenue fund



- If you are contractually obligated to use your current hauler, need to have separate paperwork/invoices for our solid waste grant
- Equipment updates required every odd numbered year
- Must request disposition of equipment if no longer using
- Equipment & controlled assets must be maintained on local & regional inventory
- Handwritten Applications Not Accepted
- Incomplete applications will receive no further consideration



- Request for reimbursement
 - To be eligible for reimbursement, a cost must have been approved and incurred & paid for within the time period of the grant contract
 - All reports must be turned in and project tasks complete
 - Results report & progress reports
- Pass-Through Grant Recipient Request for Funds
 - Request for reimbursement & Financial Status Report
 - Acknowledgement of receipt
- Documentation-invoices & copy of canceled checks bank or CC statement. Make sure it shows invoice that it is tied to
 - Copies of all materials & documents produced with grant funds:
 - Reports
 - Plans
 - Educational materials
 - Videos or digital photos of equipment and/or pictures depicting activities
 - One copy of any advertising &/or promotional materials



- Must agree to maintain during the Contract Period adequate insurance coverage sufficient to protect ETCOG & the TCEQ from all claims & liability for injury to persons & for damage to property arising from the Contract
 - Eligible for reimbursement under the grant. Copies of insurance will be required when submitting reimbursement paperwork
 - TCEQ will review the insurance costs on a case-by case basis, in the context of the specific project to determine if they are reasonable & necessary
 - For events, costs would be reimbursed only for the time period of the event
- Must acknowledge where funds come from on any communications
 - Example: Funding for this event provided by ETCOG through a TCEQ Solid Waste Grant



- Site visit
 - Minimum One Scheduled per grant period
- Reporting is required
 - Quarterly Progress
 - Results
 - Year Later Results
- Project changes if different from application, require written permission prior to spend in order to be reimbursable. (budget categories, items not listed on application, scope etc.)
- Must support the ETCOG Regional Solid Waste Management Plan Goals & Objectives

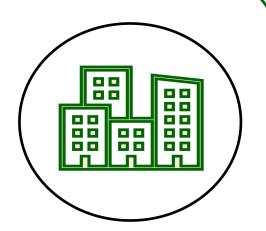

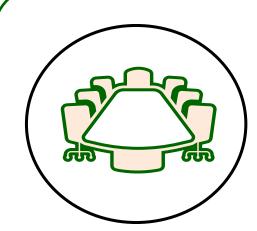

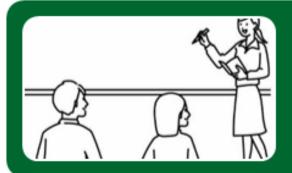

ELIGIBLE PROJECT CATEGORIES SOURCE REDUCTION & RECYCLING

- Facility design & construction
- Equipment:
 - Chippers
 - Balers
 - Crushers (non-trash)
 - Recycling & composting containers
 - Trailers
 - **Forklifts**
 - Trucks





ELIGIBLE PROJECT CATEGORIES HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT

- Household hazardous waste (HHW) is defined as any solid waste classified as hazardous which is generated in a household by a consumer
- Focused On:
 - Collection
 - Recycling
 - Re-use
 - Proper disposal
- Must be coordinated through the TCEQ/External Relations Division
- Be aware of registration and TCEQ notification requirements







ELIGIBLE PROJECT CATEGORIES LITTER & ILLEGAL DUMPING CLEANUP & **COMMUNITY COLLECTION EVENTS**







- Periodic community collection events
 - Only items for which no collection alternative is available (such as large & bulky items)
 - Not regular household trash that is normally picked up on trash day
- Placement of trash receptacles in public areas with chronic littering problems
- As much material as possible should be diverted from area landfills & targeted for reuse or recycling



ELIGIBLE PROJECT CATEGORIES CITIZENS' COLLECTION STATIONS & "SMALL" REGISTERED TRANSFER STATIONS



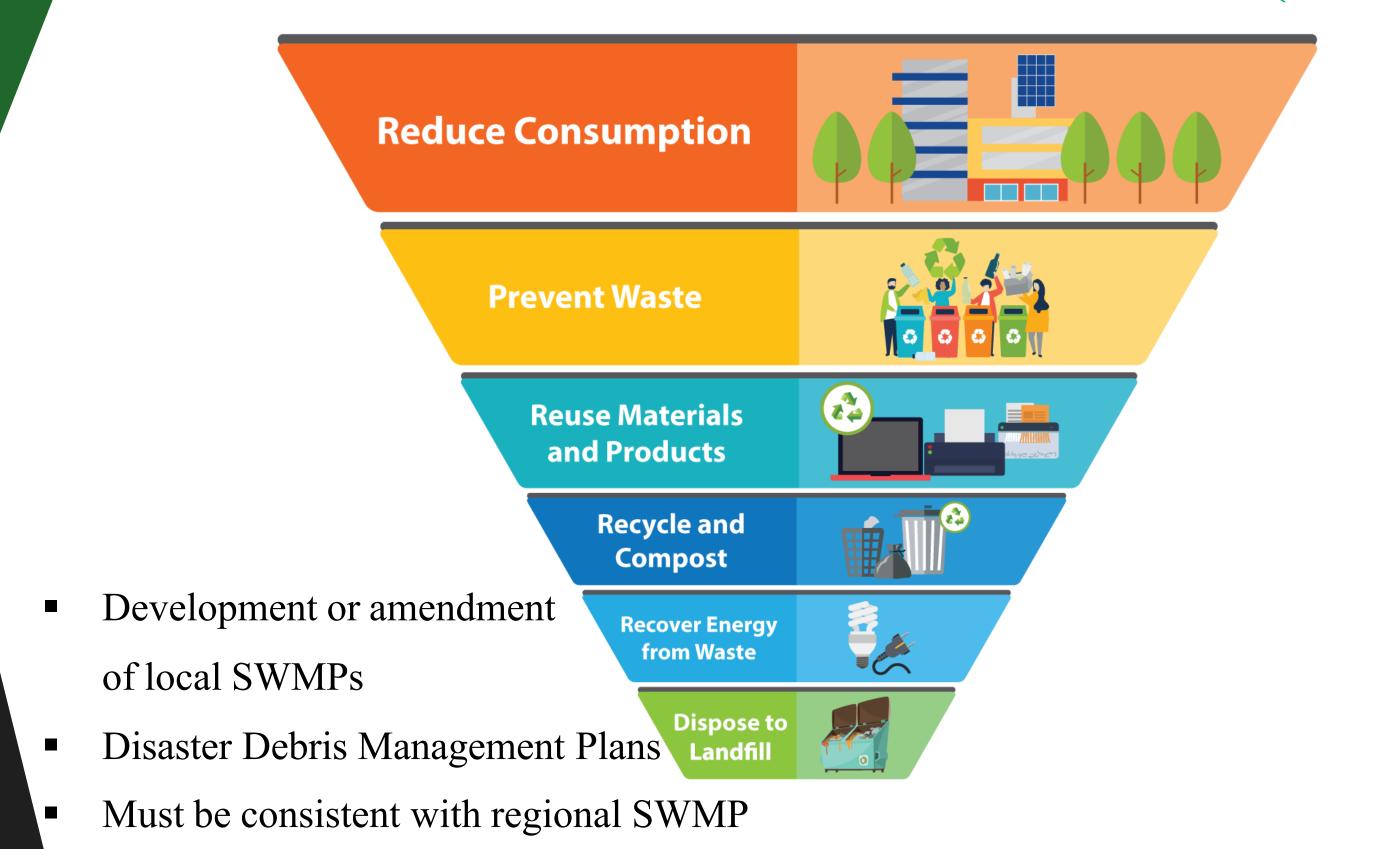
- Construction & equipment for citizens' MSW collection stations
 - Incorporation of recycling options is encouraged
 - Upgrades
 - New Equipment

- Design & construction of MSW transfer stations that qualify for registration or notification
 - No projects requiring permits

- Collection & analysis of data & information for use in making local solid waste management decisions
 - Analysis of issues & needs
 - Evaluation of alternative solutions
 - Public input
 - Recommended actions

Eligible Items

Eligible Items

Ineligible Expense Categories

- Firearms, ammunition, Hazmat gear and self-contained breathing apparatus
- Code Enforcement Positions-Cannot supplant existing salary. Must be new position, new employee
- Acquire land or an interest in land
- Funds may not be used to purchase food, meals, beverages or other refreshments
- Payment of salaries to any employee who uses alcoholic beverages on active duty
- Employment, contracts for services of a lobbyist, or for dues to an organization, which employs or otherwise contracts for the services of a lobbyist



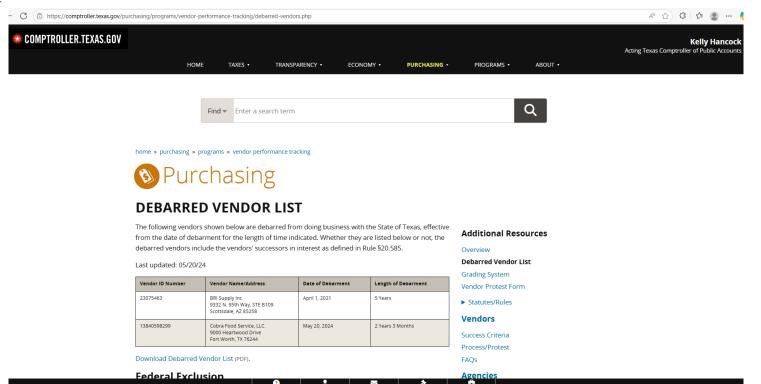
INELIGIBLE EXPENSES CONTINUED

- Except specifically authorized, projects or facilities that require a permit from the TCEQ &/or that are located within the boundaries of a permitted facility, including landfills, wastewater treatment plants, or other facilities
 - Restriction may be waived by the TCEQ, at its discretion, for recycling & other eligible activities that will take place within the boundaries of a permitted facility
- Assist an entity or individual to comply with an existing or pending federal, state, or local judgment or enforcement action
 - Funds may not be used to pay penalties imposed on an entity for violation of federal, state, or local laws & regulations
- Public & private entities subject to payment of state solid waste disposal fees & whose payments are in arrears may not receive funds through either a pass-through grant or subcontract



INELIGIBLE EXPENSES CONTINUED

• Funds may not be provided through a pass-through grant or subcontract to any public or private entity that is barred from participating in state contracts by the Texas Facilities Commission



- Activities, projects, programs, studies, etc. that overlap or duplicate funding for projects under other State funding programs are not authorized
- Cleanup of hazardous waste will not be eligible for funding

- Completed grant project summary/description
- Project cost evaluation
- Level of commitment
- Scope of work
- Completed budget section
- Provided supplemental documentation for the budget and proposed project
- Matching funds, in-kind services & total project costs
- Completed scope/timeline section
- Completed private sector notification, if the proposed project type is source reduction and recycling, citizens' collection stations and "Small" registered transfer stations, or a demonstration project under the education and training project category

Municipal Solid Waste Grants



REQUIRED ATTACHMENTS TO THE APPLICATION

- Resolution/Court Order by the Applicant's governing body authorizing the submission of the application
- If indirect costs are included in the project budget, attach the Applicant's latest indirect cost allocation plan, including documentation of approval of the plan & the indirect cost rate by the Applicant's Federal Cognizant Agency or State Coordinating Agency.
- Attach any written comments submitted by private industry if applicable
- If the Applicant is a law enforcement entity, & if compliance with TCLEOSE rules is still pending, attach a certification from TCLEOSE to indicate that the Applicant is in the process of achieving compliance with the rules (see Form 3, Certification No. 11).
- Attached Letters of Support (required for Regional Collaborative Projects)
- Certifications & Assurances (included in application).



TIMELINE

August 18	Call for Projects Applications Opens
September 3	Grant Workshop (Required)
September 29	Application Submittal Deadline (4 PM)
October 2-15	Private Industry Notification /Review/Public Review Period
October 2	SWAC Review Begins
November 18	Project Presentations/Grant Recommendations
December 4	Grant Award Recommendations to ETCOG Executive Committee
December	TCEQ Review and Approval
January 2026	Grant Contracts Anticipated



PROJECT PRESENTATIONS & SCORING

- November TBD, SWAC scoring meeting & project presentations
- 5-10 minutes per project
- Brief, concise presentation (highlight key points, committee has already reviewed application). Make sure the person that comes to give the presentation is very familiar with the project application, the existing program, & other existing programs in your county
- Q&A with the SWAC
- SWAC will break into another room to determine project funding
- SWAC recommended projects announced
- Eligible projects may receive full or partial funding
- Eligible projects for which there is not sufficient funding may be placed on a contingency list



TIPS

- Applicants are encouraged to submit early in case of technical difficulties
- Make sure your project is solid waste related
- How will you measure the success/effectiveness of your project. Make sure all are ready to collect data
- Additional supporting documentation (quotes, proof of estimated costs, photos, maps, plans, etc.) is strongly encouraged



TIPS CONTINUED

- Strategic use of handouts
 - Best to include in application not at presentation (equipment etc.)
- Have a good strong summary/description
- Make sure you complete all sections
- Make sure you address all the review criteria. Answer each question clearly & concisely. Be careful not to deviate too much from the review criteria



TIPS CONTINUED

- Know your agency's purchasing and payment process
 - Make sure that you have time for any necessary procurement, hiring or training and getting invoices paid and required proof of payments before end of contract
- Budgets should be neither obviously extravagant nor clearly inadequate
 - Be sure that the expenses requested are eligible
- Equipment costs, consider adding up to 5% to total unit cost to allow for price increases from grant application development time to actual purchase time for 2nd year projects
- Do your homework. Make sure your equipment requests match your level of need.
 - Purchase the right equipment for your job
 - Be sure that the equipment will be used for solid waste purposes 100% of the time
 - Make sure you will have time to purchase & receive the equipment during the grant period



TIPS CONTINUED

- Consider adjusting salary requests to allow for the time necessary to recruit a new employee
- Partnerships make for a stronger application
 - Start talking with those in your group & those you will be partnering with now
- Plan ahead to ensure that all documents requiring approval are submitted with the application If it is not possible to obtain these documents prior to submitting the application, you must submit them when you make your presentation
- Matching funds not required but help to demonstrate commitment
- You may request that ETCOG staff conduct a preliminary review & provide comments on your draft application
 - Please make sure you allow adequate time for staff review
