Together, we created insightful work that will have lasting value.





After paying his dues writing for publications in Texas, Lefko received the news: the Indianapolis Indy Star newspaper was offering him the position of sports editor.


In this new role, Lefko directed sports coverage for major events, including an NFL Super Bowl. The Indianapolis Colts played the Chicago Bears. As


Zayla RiveraPublication Layout Designer
