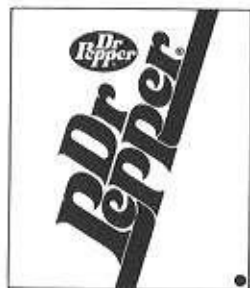

**Poster Artist** GARY KELLEY is a UNI graduate, a former art director and graphic designer and is currently an illustrator and vice-president with Hellman Associates in Waterloo. He has collected 4 gold and 2 silver medals from the New York Society of Illustrators annual exhibits in recent years, and his work has been chosen for a number of other awards annuals across the country. Gary's client list includes Time-Life Books, Sports Illustrated, Boy's Life, RCA Records, The National Football League and many other publishers, magazines and advertising agencies nationwide. Locally he has helped promote University of Northern Iowa Theatre and Athletics with his poster work. Gary, and his wife, Linda, and their two children, Cydney and Kyle, are long-time Cedar Falls residents.

**GRAND MARSHAL** — Dale Holmes, Chief of the Cedar Falls Fire Department, has seen a lot of changes during his 45 years on the force. He started as a firefighter in 1941, worked his way through the ranks of lieutenant and captain, and became the third Chief in the history of the department in 1956.

When he joined the department, he was one of only four paid firefighters. A team of 22 volunteers rounded out the firefighting team. When a fire occurred, bells in the homes of these volunteers would ring and a telephone operator would come on the central line to tell them where to meet the trucks.

His tenure as Chief for the past thirty years covers a time of growth in the department. In 1961, the city decided to hire a full department which today has grown to 37 firefighters. The current station was built that same year to provide quarters for the men on duty and garage space for the trucks and ambulances. In 1975, a substation was built to serve the North Cedar area.

"I got in when the city started booming," he said. "I've always had good city councils to work with, and there have always been good men in my department."

1986 will go down as a special year in the annals of the Cedar Falls Fire Department and in the life of Chief Dale Holmes. It's the 45th anniversary of his career with the department, his 30th year as Chief, and the 70th anniversary of the first gasoline-powered fire truck in Cedar Falls.

A salute to the Grand Marshal of Sturgis Falls Festival XI — Dale Holmes — a man who made Cedar Falls a better place to live and work.

Annabeth plans to study acting in college and act professionally as much as she can along the way.

**Our Cedar Falls Statue of Liberty** has a story of its own, according to local historian, George Brown. The Statue that sits in Overman Park was the project of the Boy Scouts, Wapsipinican Council, Cedar Falls District in 1949-50. The "idea" was formulated by a Kansas City, Missouri, man who was in the business of making some electrical wiring for automobile parts. This gentleman, made the dyes for parts to the Statue, which was made out of pressed metal and welded together. These Statues were offered throughout the United States through the Scout organization and many areas of the country responded and made the purchase of a Statue of Liberty replica a Scout/community project. The Statues were sold for \$300.00 and the Cedar Falls community did respond. The plans for the stand/base came with the Statue (also plans for an entire replica for Ellis Island in the shape of a multi-pointed star). Due to the cost of the project, the foundation that the Statue sits on was the extent of the Statue base. A meeting was held in St. Joseph, Missouri, where the first Statue was erected. Mr. Brown, who was himself heavily involved in the project, traveled to St. Joseph to take advantage of their experience. An actress living in that community did a reading at the time of their dedication . . . as follows:

*Not like the brazen giant of Greek fame,  
With conquering limbs astride from land to land;  
Here at our sea-washed, sunset gates shall stand  
A mighty woman with a torch, whose flame  
Is the imprisoned lightning, and her name  
Mother of Exiles. From here beacon-hand  
Glows world-wide welcome; her mild eyes  
command*

*The air-bridged harbor that twin cities frame.  
"Keep ancient lands, your storied pomp!" cries she  
With silent lips. "Give me your tired, your poor,  
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,  
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.  
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me,  
I lift my lamp beside the golden door!"*

At some point along the way, the Statue (due to the rusting out of bolts) blew over during a strong wind and an arm was broken. The Statue was repaired and "painted the copper color" you have seen during later years. The actual Statue is a lovely copper metal and should be restored and allowed to "age" naturally. This is now a project of the Sturgis Falls Celebration Board.



## CELEBRATE 95 YEARS OF MUSIC



Our Cedar Falls Municipal Band has had a long and illustrious history. Organized in 1891, in its heyday, it has been acclaimed as the nation's finest non-professional musical group. In the 1920's it became the first municipal non-professional band to purchase its own rehearsal hall. It also established and maintained bands for younger players up until the mid 1950's.

For many years 'Convention Band of Iowa' was its motto and the group attended 30 national and state conventions bringing home honors in 1913, 1924, 1930, 1931, and 1935.

First known as the AOUW Military Band under the direction of J. A. Fitzgerald it continued under F. L. McCreary as director from 1907 to 1929. James A. Melichar who retired in 1976, directed for 47 years. His successor, Tony Lund led the band through 1984 when the present director Dennis Downs took over the baton. Melichar, Lund and Downs all presently reside in Cedar Falls.

Our Band continues to share its rich heritage when it performs each summer regularly in Overman Park. Its members have lead our Sturgis Falls Celebration parade each year and they have led off the afternoon entertainment in Overman Park for all eleven years of the Celebration.

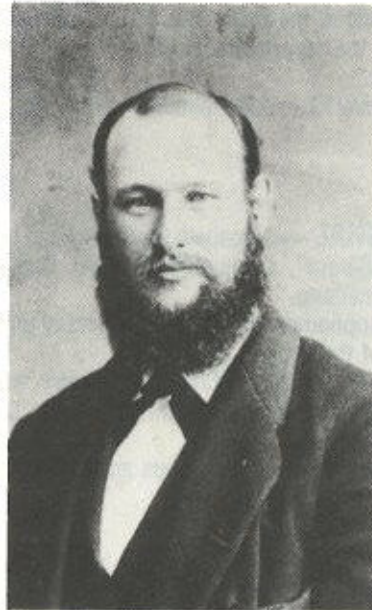
Cedar Falls is justifiably proud of this historic organization.

## CELEBRATE WILLIAM STURGIS

We join in celebration of William Sturgis, the man who settled beside the Cedar River in 1845. Sturgis, renowned as the first permanent settler in Black Hawk County, claimed a site which included the mill site and the water power provided by the river. He and his wife, Dorothy Joslyn Kidder, built a double log cabin where the Ice House Museum is now located.

William Sturgis was first to turn the prairie sod of the county. His daughter Jessie, was born on October 1, 1846, the first child of the new settlement. By the spring of 1847, there were ten families located in Sturgis Falls. Only after he moved on West did the remaining settlers rename the city Cedar Falls.

We celebrate William Sturgis for his foresight, his initiative, and his dreams. We have celebrated Sturgis Falls in his memory each June since the 1976 Bicentennial in the parks which were part of his original claim. Celebrate with us in honor of the man who left behind the legacy of a city — beautiful Cedar Falls.
