

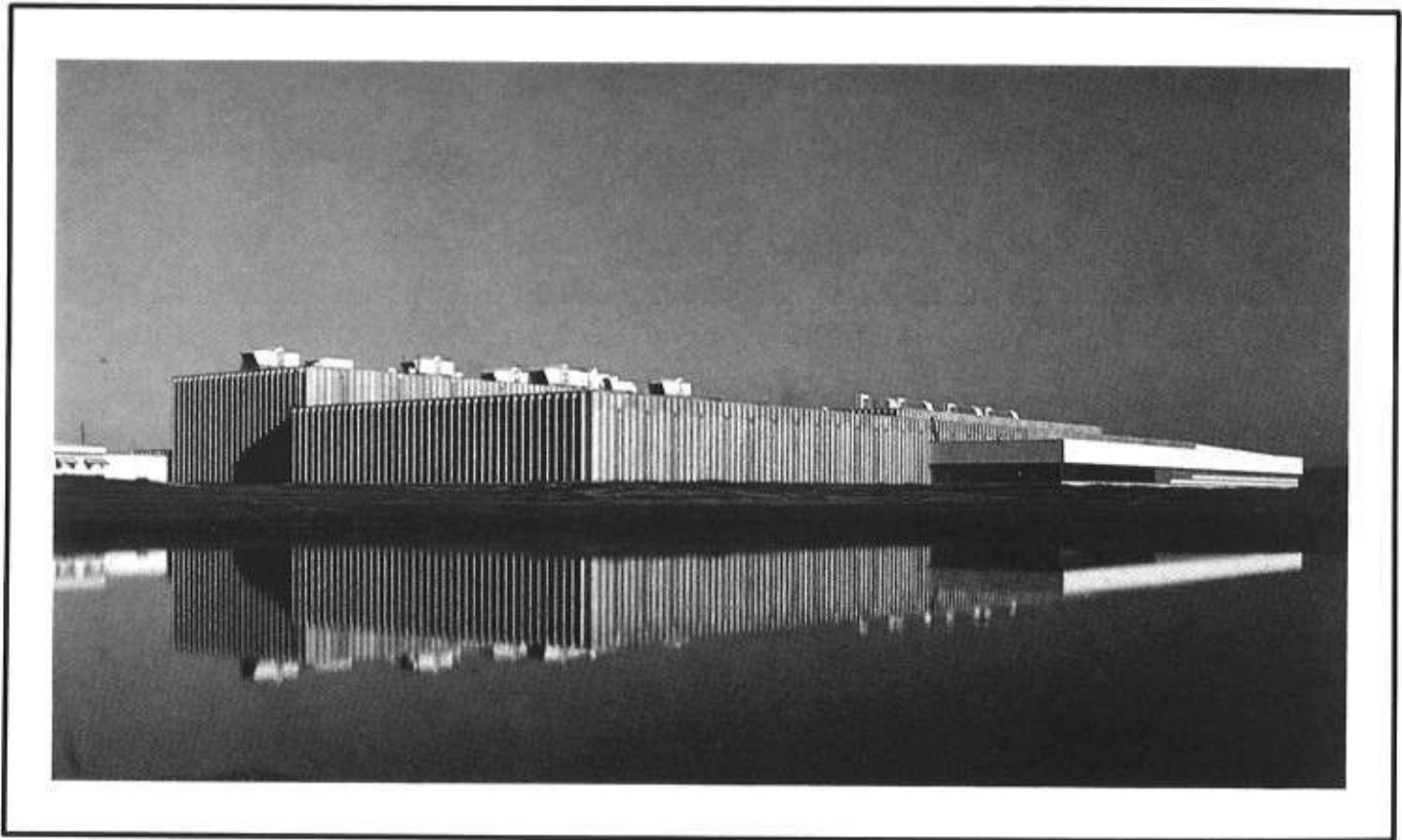

# THE STURGIS FALLS CELEBRATION PRESENTS

## 1992 Cornerstone Award To The Voorhees Family

The Cornerstone Award honors the Voorhees family. Each year this award recognizes community members or organizations who have contributed to the city, the firm foundation which has made Cedar Falls a place to live, thrive and be proud of.



In the early 1900's, Walter Voorhees was a member of the Cedar Falls Park Board and Chamber. While serving on the Park Board, Walter was instrumental in developing Washington Park and Golf Course and Island Park. As a result of his involvement and interest in golf, he expanded his business from manufacturing farm equipment to developing golf equipment. He was also instrumental in

promoting the game in Cedar Falls. In time his sons, Maynard and Robert added their talents to the family business. Through their foresight and innovation, the Voorhees family contributed to the standardization and development of many pieces of golf equipment used presently. Standard Golf Company, based in Cedar Falls, has grown into an international business.

The Voorhees' also influenced the Cedar Falls school system through the efforts of Maynard Voorhees. Maynard served on the school board from 1950-67, serving as President of the Board in 1955-59 and 1960-67. During his seventeen years on the Board, Maynard encouraged the expansion and improvement of Cedar Falls school system. He supported the construction of five ele-



mentary schools, two junior highs, and a high school plus many building additions as well as pushed for the implementation of new courses, educational methods and programs, such as special education. Maynard's community involvement was not limited to education. He was active in Boy Scouts and the Lions Club for several years, and served as a Board Member of the Chamber of Commerce, 1971-73.



Robert "Bob" Voorhees was also active in the Cedar Falls community. He served two terms on the City Council, 1954-56 and 1958-60. He also served two terms on the Chamber Board 1953-55 and 1960-62. Bob was a Trustee of the Cedar Falls Utilities and a Board Member of The Cedar Falls Trust & Savings Bank. Bob participated in fundraising efforts for various organizations in-

cluding the YMCA and the Cedar Falls Public Library. In 1982 he received the Chamber Representative Citizens Award for his contributions to the community.

The Voorhees' tradition continues through Bob's children, Peter "Pete" Voorhees and Sara Voorhees Gregory and Maynard's son James. Peter is a Board Member of the Firststar Bank as well as President of the James and Meryl Hearst Center for the Arts Board of Directors. In past years, Sara has been active in several organizations and committees such as Community Main Street and the State Committee on Planned Parenthood.

The Voorhees family continues to operate Standard Golf Company in Cedar Falls, Peter, President, Sara, Vice President and James, Plant Supervisor.

# 1992 CEDAR BASIN JAZZ FESTIVAL

## FEATURE PRESENTATIONS

*This year we are pleased to feature 4 of the finest Dixieland bands in the U.S. Don't miss these great bands.*



Returning to his year's Cedar Basin Festival after an exciting inaugural performance here in 1990, is the *Natural Gas Jazz Band* from San Francisco. The band has been together for 21 years, devoting an extraordinary commitment of time to develop a unique, tight ensemble sound. These seasoned musicians have worked up an extensive collection of traditional jazz, emphasizing the music of Jelly Roll Morton, Bix Beiderbecke, Lu Watters, and Turk Murphy.

Having been closely associated with Lu and Turk, Natural Gas Jazz musicians have a special affinity for San Francisco jazz tradition. The popularity of the Natural Gas Jazz Band has earned them appearances at most of the major festivals, including Bix 5 times, the Sacramento, CA, Jubilee 17 consecutive years, and repeat performances at many others. Now, add the Sturgis Falls Dixieland Jazz Festival to that list! The band has also been international ambassadors of traditional jazz, playing among other locations, in Europe, the Far East, and in post-glasnost USSR, as the first American jazz band to play in Siberia. The Natural Gas JB's musicians reflect a number of "rest of the time" professions: Phil Crumley, leader, and cornetist, is a dentist; drummer Warren Perry is a lawyer. Dave Lewis, tuba, is a manufacturer; while Harry Schlafman, banjo, supervises a large engineering and construction company when not on tour! Bob Murphy, soprano sax, is in legal research, teaches music, and has his own jazz trio. Trombonist Ed Zimbrick manages a real estate office; and Pete Clute devotes his professional life to piano.



*Custer's Last Band*, from Sacramento, is making its first appearance at the Cedar Basin Festival this year. The band was formed in 1985 by Jerry Mackenzie, reed instruments and banjo; and his wife, Jan Sutherland, vocalist, who has been dubbed the "New Empress of the Blues"! Making the music jump on trumpet is Renard Perry, whose style will remind listeners of Louis Armstrong and Bob Scobey. Completing the front line is the fine trombonist, Sam Smith. The

rhythm section has three talented musicians. Jim Hudson Lenhart, bass, and Jack Turner, drums, give the band the kind of drive that makes its jazz hot and its blues haunting. At the piano for this festival will be Tom Shove, who is well-known for his playing in San Francisco's Gold Nugget Lounge.



The Sturgis Falls Cedar Basin Jazz Festival welcomes *Igor's Cowboy Jazz Band* from Tempe, Arizona. The band presents Western Swing cowboy vocals and traditional Dixieland Jazz in a fresh, high-energy portrayal of U.S. music from the deep South to the great Southwest. Leader Igor Glenn has revived the lost art of "slap" bass and sings in a four-octave range. His credentials include a college degree in music, a stint with the New Christy Minstrels, and appearances on the Johnny Carson and David Frost shows. Appearing at over 2 dozen festivals in 1991 also, the band has been featured on a PBS special, has performed to large crowds on a U.S. State Department cultural tour of major cities in

Mexico, and was recognized by Parliament in British Columbia, Canada. Igor's experience guides this fresh troupe of aggressive harmony singers who play a combination of instruments including bass, guitar, fiddle, mandolin, banjo, trombone, trumpet, and drums. Period costuming includes cavalry uniforms typical of the band's home state of Arizona. Hang on for a wild musical ride!



### *"New" Red Onion Jazz Babies*

The "New" Red Onion Jazz Babies, from Kansas City, were last at our Festival in 1990. The Jazz Babies came into existence in June 1981, organized by head Jazz Baby Don "Shotgun" Carlton, trumpet/cornet, to play on Sundays at the Bristol Bar & Grill in Kansas City, MO. The band's colorful name was taken from an early jazz band. After celebrating 10 years, the band is still playing traditional Dixieland and ragtime

jazz at the Bristol, as well as for a wealth of fans locally and all over the country. This year alone, the Jazz Babies will appear, among other places, at Bix, and jazz festivals in Memphis and Lake of the Ozarks.

This is the birthday weekend of Ole Master Jazz Baby Ray Ehrhart, piano, who will be 84 years young! Other band members include: Steve Patke, clarinet, soprano sax; Dan Strom, trombone; Paul Rodabaugh, tuba; Peter Kersten, banjo/vocals; and Kent Rausch, drums/vocals.

*The Sugar Daddys Jazz Band* is a fun-loving group of professional musicians. The Sugar Daddys is a Dixieland swing band, whose music ranges from hard driving traditional

jazz, to slow and easy dance music. It is sprinkled with vocals by the band members. The Sugar Daddys is a high-energy band that puts its heart and soul into providing fun and entertainment for its audiences, as well as playing Dixieland music at its finest. With 142 stage performances in the past 2 years, including 10 festivals, they are considered one of the top, if not the top Dixieland band in the State of Iowa. They have just completed their 4th recording. Members include: from Waverly, J. R. Iverson, clarinet, Orlyn Schutte, trumpet, who have traveled and played with many dance bands and Dixieland bands for over 40 years; from Denver, Jim Moeller, tuba and bass, graduate from the Wartburg School of Music, and has played with many bands; Daren Saner, drums, graduate from Wartburg School of Music; from Waterloo, Wayne Marth, trombone, graduate from Naval School of Music, fronted his own band for years; and from Cedar Falls, Gene Lehman, banjo, played with Dixieland bands for 20 years, and Tedda Hach, piano, graduate from Nebraska School of Music, has been director of music and organ in several churches for years, as well as Dixieland piano for years.



*The Saint's Dixieland Jazz Band* has appeared at jazz festivals across the country, including the Sacramento, CA, Jubilee, the Bix Festival, and many others. Credits include commercial albums and initial sponsorship of the Sturgis Falls Dixieland Jazz Festival. Dick Smith, manager/banjo, is a retired professional engineer and founder of the Sturgis Falls Festival. He is a part-time engineering consultant with the DNR and a Dixieland enthusiast since hearing his first Bix recording in 1928. Judd Truax, trombone/vocals, is Cedar Falls city attorney and 1 of the 2 original Saints' members. His tailgate trombone (Kid Ory style) provides a true New

Orleans flavor. Dr. Dave Smith, cornet, a chiropractor in Allston, IA, began his career with the band on piano and is a student of the Bix style. Dr. Paul Rider, brass bass, is chemistry professor at the University of Northern Iowa, executive director of the Iowa Academy of Science, and member of the Cedar Falls City Council. A long-time member of the Saints, he plays many instruments and appears in other musical groups as well as being considered an expert in Jazz history. Bob Crumley, clarinet/vocals, has a full musical background, including the 74th Army Band in Vietnam, as well as combos, including R&B. A resident of Allston, Bob is Director of Community Services, Butler County. Piano/vocals are contributed by John Heim, high school choir director at Marion, IA, Independent Schools. A traditional jazz enthusiast, John has played various instruments in many area bands. Drummer Scott Chidester, a music performance graduate from UNI, plays with the Saints and performs with other groups. He represents the excellence in young musicians which is so important to the perpetuation of traditional jazz.



*Bill Shepherd's Red Hots* are a Cedar Falls, IA, based jazz band that brings outstanding musicianship to the world of Dixieland. The primary focus of the group is to perform each summer at festivals in Eastern Iowa, including the Sturgis Falls Cedar Basin Festival. The rest of the year, the band members perform in a variety of musical groups ranging from the Waterloo/Cedar Falls Symphony to Dixieland church services. Bill Shepherd, leader, who plays trombone, Bruce Chidester, trumpet, and Randy Hogencamp, drums, are all professors in the School of Music at the University of Northern Iowa. Dr. Paul Rider, bass, is a professor in the Chemistry Department at UNI; and Dr. Paul Tenney, clarinet, is a doctor at the UNI Health Services. Terry Kroese, piano, is a band director in the Waterloo public schools; and Connie Toenjes, vocalist, is a vocal music teacher in the Cedar Falls Public Schools.

have think it" that night at the Depot in 1975.

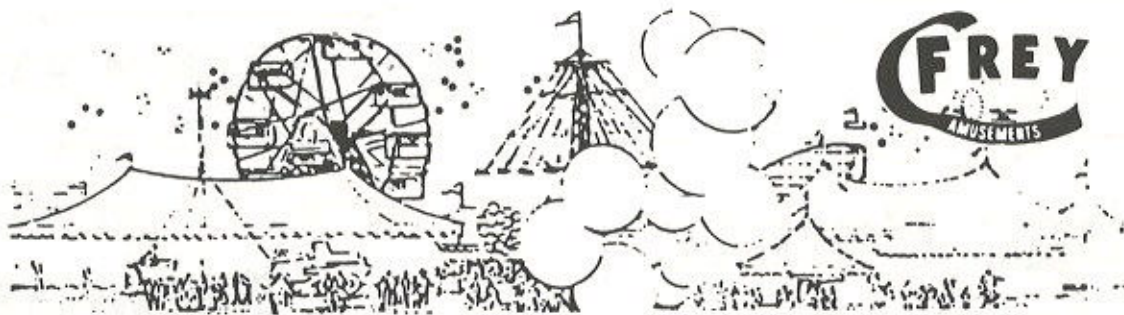
