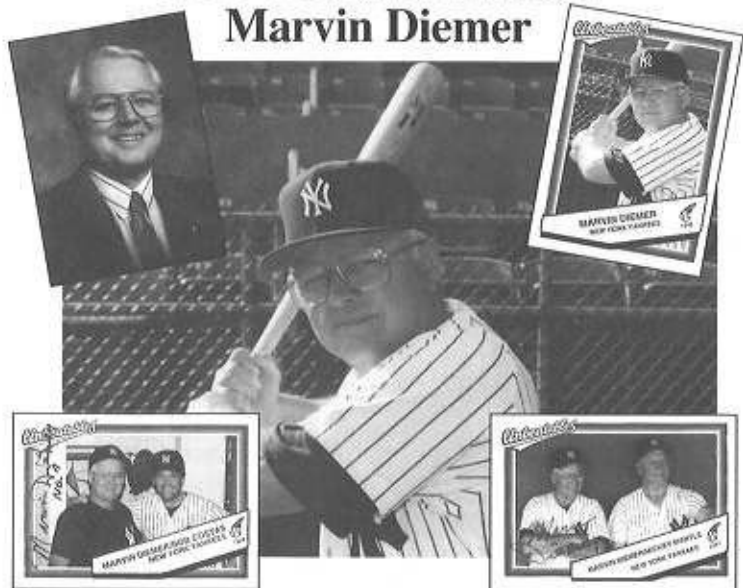

The Sturgis Falls Celebration has almost as many things to offer as what you could imagine. Each year the Celebration brings back items and events that the public wishes to see and experience again, and also, each year brings new and different offerings to the public. Many types of talents are offered, in many locations. Most activities are located in and around the extraordinary park system in the City of Cedar Falls. If you have a hobby to show or a talent to share, Sturgis Falls is the place for you.

While the Sturgis Falls Celebration makes history each year, they also have living history events of all types. And, much of the fun of the Celebration is just being part of the crowd. Endless numbers of people seem to be working, resting, carrying food ... seeing family, friends and loved ones, and smiling... always smiling.

The Sturgis Falls Celebration/Cedar Basin Jazz Festival now attracts over 200,000 local, community and regional residents, the event attracts statewide and nationwide attention, beckoning persons from all of the 50 states to come to Cedar Falls and participate. Family members who have moved away choose this time of year to have their "Homecoming" so they may visit family and see familiar faces, and many class reunions are held. The Sturgis Falls Celebration/Cedar Basin Jazz Festival has something to offer everyone... just what the founders had in mind. Twenty years later, the three people whose vision set the Celebration on its path are pleased that the years of planning, dedication and hard work bore such wonderful fruition. And, you can be sure, from the founders... Rosemary Beach, Judith Cutler and Tom Klemuk... this is what they did for love.

of various backgrounds and interests work together to provide a spirited outpouring of old-fashioned fun. STURGIS FALLS is small-town America at its best - a sort of county fair, Fourth of July Celebration and talent exhibition all rolled into one.



This once-a-year tradition began as an idea in 1975 when Bicentennial fever swept the land. The organizers shared a vision of what they thought the Celebration should be. They wanted an event that accepted all persons, all talents, all service and civic organizations, amateurs, and professionals presenting a combination of "Danish Days" (which had been held in Cedar Falls many years prior), band concerts and the type of old-fashioned Fourth of July we remembered from our childhood. As a way of honoring the community's roots, the suggestion was made to name the event "Sturgis Falls Days" after the first permanent settler, William Sturgis. In 1845, Sturgis built a log cabin on the south bank of the Cedar River, near the present day site of the Ice House Museum in Cedar Falls.

The first Celebration drew large crowds 12,000 - 15,000, in one park - Overman- with people coming from throughout Northeast Iowa to look over and buy wares from street vendors and to watch performances by a variety of entertainers - from Dixieland Jazz musicians to guitar playing folk singers. Sturgis Falls Days was a tremendous suc-

Margaret's reaction upon learning she is the 1995 choice was characteristic. "Oh, how I wish Henry were here!" Margaret's husband, who died in 1977, received the award that year. Margaret's life of service, like his, reaches out to share blessings with those around her and she does it with deep commitment and immense good humor.

Born and raised in Ruthvan, Iowa, Margaret graduated from ISTC with a degree in English. She began her teaching career in Red Oak, Iowa, for two years and finished it teaching at Holmes Junior High in Cedar Falls from 1966-1990 when she retired. During those years she was active in the Cedar Falls Education Association and served as President of the UNI Alumni Association and on the S.T.A.G.E. Inc. board for Theatre UNI.

In 1948 she interrupted her teaching career by moving to Cedar Falls, marrying Henry and raising four children. During those years she often worked in the family dry goods store in downtown Cedar Falls.

A member of the United Methodist Church, Margaret sings in the choir, belongs to United Methodist Women, has been on several church commissions, and is past president of the Administrative Board.

She was a strong guiding and working force in the restoration of the Oster Regent Theatre, serving as president of Cedar Falls Community Theatre during that time and giving significant leadership to the fundraising drive. She has been an active member of CFCT over the years as a board member, actress, director, and crew person, currently serving as volunteer coordinator. She wrote the mystery play the group is now performing monthly on the Star Clipper Dinner Train.

In addition to the local bands playing, the Cedar Basin Jazz Festival would like to welcome: Igor's Jazz Cowboys. Once again, for the 4th straight year, Igor's Jazz Cowboys from Tempe, Arizona. With a veteran lineup of musicians who have played with such well-known groups as the New Christie Minstrels and Beach Boys, playing all over the musical map, roaming through the country/western and bluegrass styles and proceeding on to big band and jazz with traditional Dixieland jazz. Big John and Igor and the rest of the group will take you on a memorable musical journey that leaves you wanting more.

Sorta Dixie Jazz Band. A touch of Las Vegas for the 2nd year in a row. They play regularly on the Strip in Vegas. Being discovered recently by the jazz festival circuit, they are much in demand. No musical style escapes them from traditional Dixieland, bebop, or mainstream. Band members have played with such jazz legends as Woody Herman, Stan Kenton, Charlie Barnett, and Tommy Dorsey. Jean Kittrell and the St. Louis Rivermen. Organized in 1982 they have performed from Coast to Coast with their special style of Dixieland, Ragtime, spirituals and the like. Their rapport, talent and selection of tunes embody jazz at it's best. Jean has graced the Cedar Basin stage, most recently in 1991 (with a smaller group). Fans will remember Red Lehr's impossible feats on the sousaphone. This group performs annually for the St. Louis Jazz Club and St. Louis Gateway Festival.

Queen City Jazz Band. Making their first appearance, this band brings to us the sounds of the 1920's jazz era. They originated in 1958 and since that time their reputation has grown to delight audiences around the world. The seven talented musicians are joined by Vocalist Wende Harston who has a blues style reminiscent of Bessie Smith. Wende sweeps audiences off their feet and "raises the roof" with her authentic gospel songs. Their home base is Denver, Colorado.
