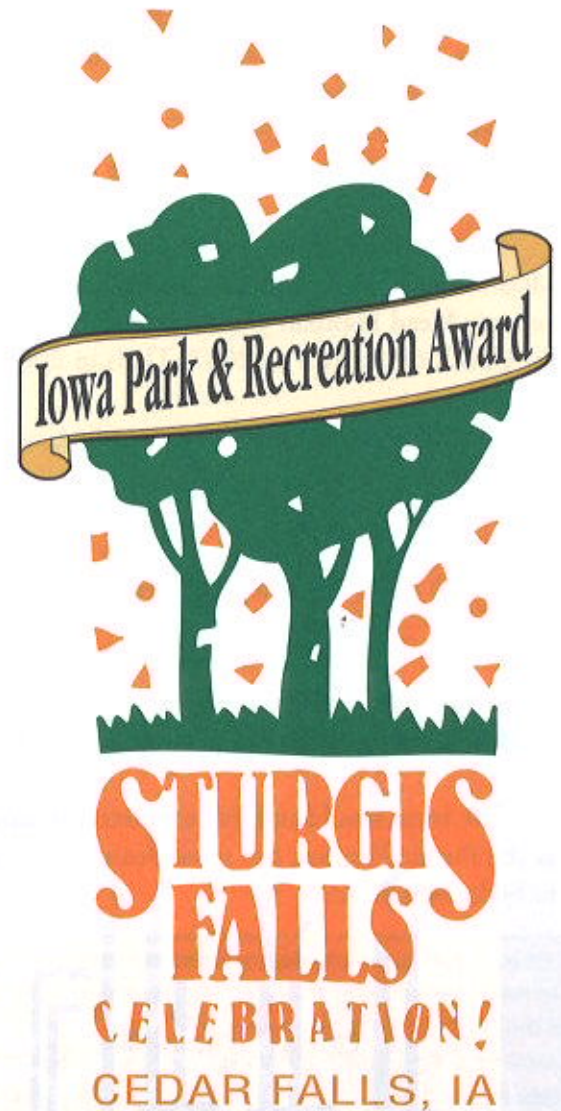

UNI Football & Coach Mark Farley

Mark Farley is no stranger to Cedar Falls. Prior to the fall of 1982, his job as a truck driver took him through Cedar Falls, where he'd stop at the UNI-Dome to check out the Panther Football Team. During his High School career at Waukon, he was a three-sport standout. As a college freshman, he walked on to the football team, red shirting the first season. He received numerous awards as a student athlete; the Special Team Award, Honorable Mention All-American, Gateway Conference co-defensive Player of the Year, Academic All American, and was selected team Co-Captain. He led the team in tackles three consecutive years.

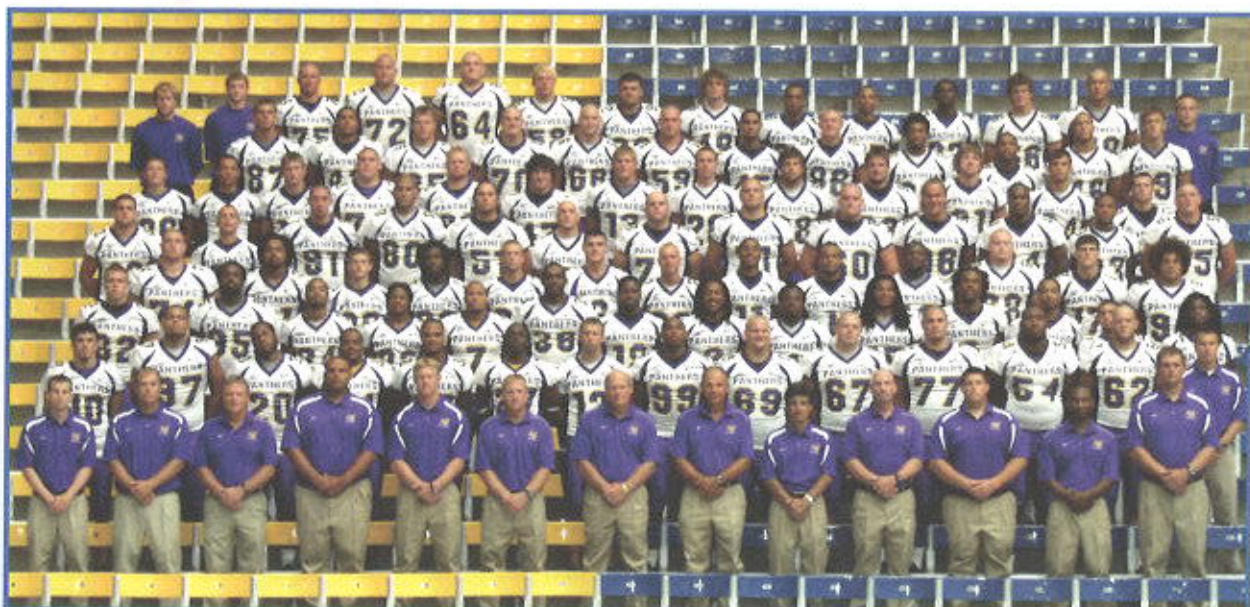
There is little doubt, Farley knows football. He worked or played under three of the best football minds - Darrell Mudra, Earle Bruce and Terry Allen. His passion for football and the University of Northern Iowa propelled him to become Head Football Coach for the University of Northern Iowa in 2001. He was awarded the Eddie Robinson Award for Coach of the Year in 2007. Then in 2008, Coach Farley took on the position of Interim Athletic Director.

He and his wife, Lori, love attending activities, such as sports, that sons, Jake and Jared, or daughter, Jamie, are involved in.

The University of Northern Iowa Football Team completed the first ever undefeated Gateway Conference, regular season (11-0) in 2007. They finished 12-1 overall and ranked No 4 in the nation reaching the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs.

Working with this winning team, is a dedicated coaching staff, consisting of Bill Salmon, Rick Nelson, Mario Verduzco, Atif Austin, Eric Chinander, Scott Frost, Chris Klieman, and Jerry Montgomery.

The team would not be complete without its mascot, T.C (The Cat). Since its inception in 1931, the mascot, known as the Purple Panther, has gone through many name and appearance changes. It was not until 1980, the Panther became to be known as T.C.



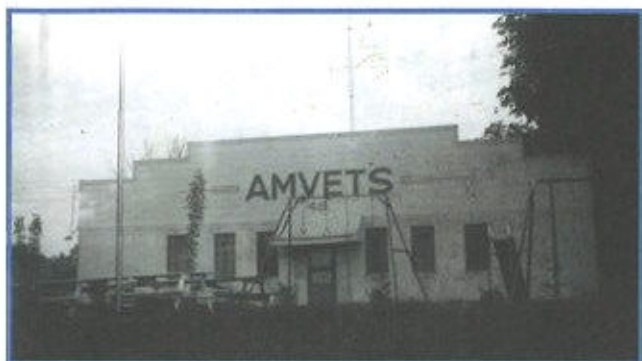
2008 Cornerstone Award

Guy W. Iverson AMVETS Post 49

It all started in 1946, when 15 World War II veterans met at the home of Anders Iverson. That day they discussed the importance of forming a new veterans organization in Cedar Falls. The AMVETS Post is a result of that meeting. Their first meeting place was at the Woodman Hall in downtown Cedar Falls. In 1950, the post was the 7th largest AMVETS Post in the nation. Today the Guy W. Iverson AMVETS Post 49 is the largest AMVETS Post in the State of Iowa. They currently have 1476 members in the Post (including The Ladies Auxiliary, Sons of Amvets and Jr. Amvets).

Over the past 62 years the AMVETS has been supporting our boys in service, our fire station, Sartori Memorial Hospital, March of Dimes and many more community events through their countless fundraisers.

The Guy W. Iverson AMVETS Post is also the home to the Ladies Auxiliary, Sons of AMVETS and the Junior AMVETS. The Guy W. Iverson AMVETS Post 39 is located at 20th and Irving Streets in Cedar Falls, Iowa.

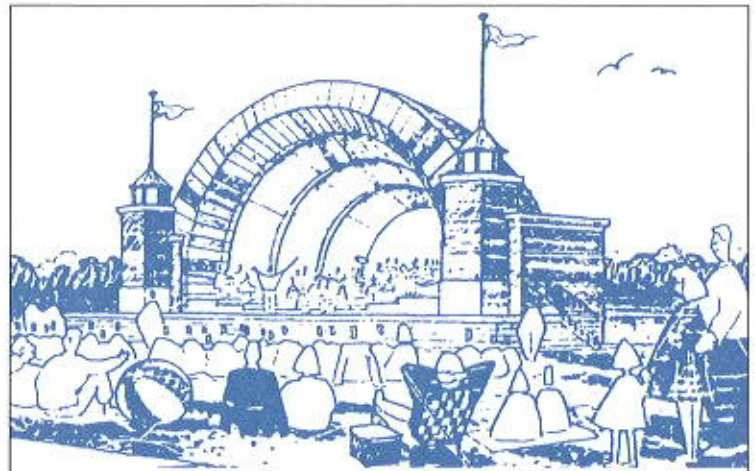


2008 Artist Elise Webber

In her spare time, Elise enjoys a quiet life at home with her dogs and spending time with close friends.



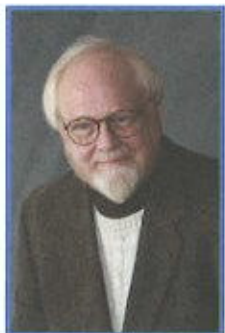

Cedar Falls 2008 Representative Citizen Hugh Pettersen

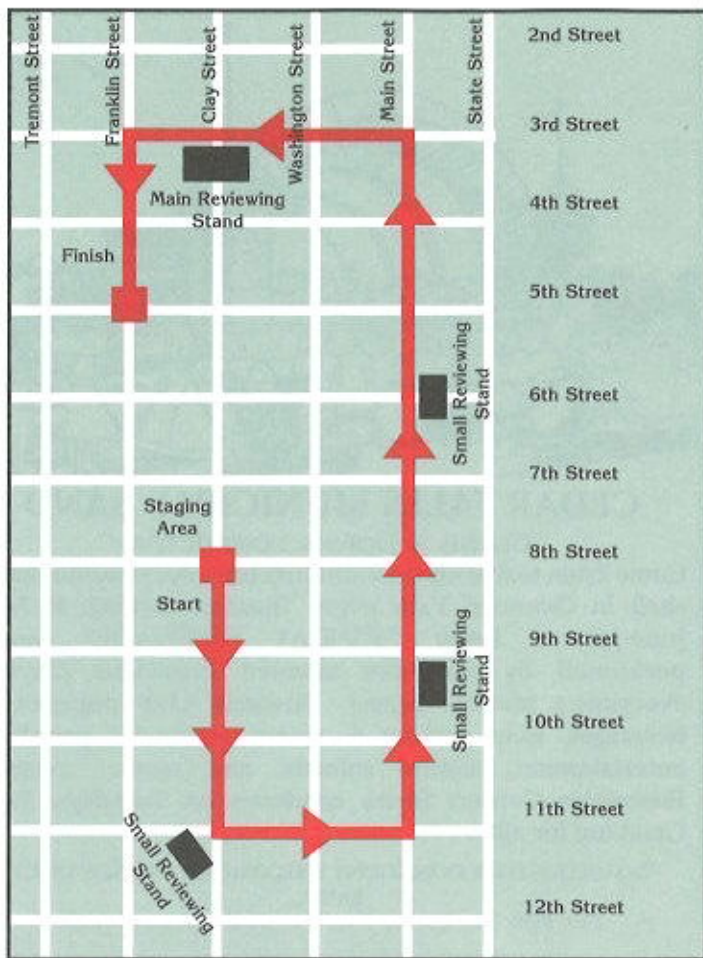

After college, he opened a clothing store business on College Street and in 1972, moved that business around the corner to 915 West 23rd Street, where the Henry W. Myrtle Art Gallery is located today.

In addition to running a business full-time for forty-five years, Hugh has used his time and talents to promote the arts and has made huge contributions to the quality of life of our community. Hugh's contributions to our community have been many and varied.

Throughout the years he has played major roles in the College Hill Neighborhood Association, College Hill Merchant and Professional Association, College Hill Arts Festival, as a member of the Cedar Falls Art and Culture Board, Cedar Falls Arts Alive (now the Friends of the Hearst) the Metropolitan Chorale, the University of Northern Iowa Civic Arts Association, Theater UNI, Waterloo-Cedar Falls Symphony, and the Gallagher Bluedorn Performing Arts Center – just to name a few.

He has served as a board member for the Friends of the Gallagher Bluedorn since its beginning. He has been a long-time, behind-the-scenes supporter for the Waterloo-Cedar Falls Symphony Orchestra and the School of Music at the University of Northern Iowa. Public Safety

For your safety and enjoyment during the Sturgis Falls Celebration weekend, the following regulations will be in effect:

You **MUST** be 21 years of age **AND** have a valid driver's license in your possession in order to obtain a wristband to purchase beer. Security people with mobile electronic age verifiers will be spot checking IDs throughout the weekend. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding of the Sturgis Falls Celebration Board's focus on curbing underage drinking and our ZERO Tolerance policy.

No liquor, beer or wine may be brought into the Cedar Falls parks during the Sturgis Falls Celebration Weekend: June 27 through June 29, 2008. **NO COOLERS.**

Weather Cancellation Policy: When inclement weather is imminent, a decision will be made to postpone or cancel activities depending on the severity of the predicted conditions and the public's safety. Lightning is the biggest factor.

Cedar Falls City Council has passed the following ordinance: Dogs and cats are prohibited from public playgrounds or parks during the last Friday, Saturday and Sunday of June each and every year, except if such animals are part of an organized public activity such as a canine frisbee contest.

NO bicycles, skateboards, roller blades, scooters or the like are allowed in any of the parks (including Overman Park). Please use a bike rack for your bike! (See map for location of bike racks).

The Franklin Street/Center Street Bridge **WILL** be open to two-way single lane traffic. If flooding occurs in Island Park (Carnival location) and/or Tourist Park (Entertainment/Rock 'n Roll location), Gateway Park will be used as a backup location for either &/or both.

Do not sit on the curb to watch the parade with your feet in the street where there is any chance of being hit by a parade entry (especially on corners, i.e. 3rd and Main!)

Please keep the interior sidewalks in Overman Park clear for emergency personnel. Stopping on the interior sidewalk also impairs the vision of seated spectators. Please be respectful of others!

There is **NO** soliciting of any kind allowed in the Parks during the Celebration weekend!

Please obey the reduced speed signs and use the pedestrian cross-walks on 1st Street between Main Street and Iowa Street.

Sartori Hospital will have a First Aid/Rest Tent in Overman Park and on The Green in Sturgis Park Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Mosquito control: Professional pest control personnel will use only legally authorized chemicals in line with all local, state & federal regulations. A public notice will be posted.
