# Spelling

Children will be set spellings each Monday. These need to be practiced at home in preparation for their weekly spelling test.

All children will be expected to read at home at least 3 x weekly, practise spellings, access Tackling Tables to practise and test at least 3 x weekly. Homework will be 'set' on a Friday with the expectation that it is handed in by the following Friday.

Children can earn stickers by handing their homework in earlier than Friday.

In addition to the above, children should complete one the following enrichment tasks each week with the expectation that all English and Maths tasks will be completed over the half term.

Practise writing long numbers and spotting the Thousands, Hundreds, Tens and Ones.
Challenge yourself to write longer numbers using Ten Thousands or even Hundred Thousands.

#### <u>Science</u>

Describe a system in the body.

Draw it, make it, write about it....the choice is yours. Make your homework the most exciting in the class.

## History

In Mesolithic times people began to farm animals. Find out and draw what a Mesolithic settlement looked like.

## Geography

Explore your local area and create a map OR find a map of your local area and use it to navigate around your village/town with your grown ups.

## <u>Art</u>
