Armstrong Class Topic Map Autumn 2

What an exciting term we have planned! The run up to Christmas is always exciting and a little tiring. Please have a read through the information on this topic map as it will help you support your child with their learning. Having conversations over dinner or on the way to and from school can provide excellent opportunities for you to ask questions about what your child is learning across the curriculum. By answering questions and engaging in discussions, your child will be beginning to master their own knowledge and understanding by recalling their learning.

Maths

This half term we will be continuing our learning on Addition and Subtraction. As the term progresses we will move onto Multiplication and Division.

It is so important that the children continue to learn their multiplication tables as this plays an important role in such a wide range of mathematical skills, and are working towards the National Times Table Check in June.

English

This term we will continue to embed our SPAG skills—expanded noun phrases, conjunctions, fronted adverbials and speech punctuation.

We will be writing to entertain and to persuade. Using Arthur and the Golden Rope and The Polar Express as our stimuli.

<u>Reading</u>

During dedicated Whole Class Reading lessons, the children will engage with extracts from a wide range of books. This enables the children to dip their toes into a range of books as well as encountering a rich range of vocabulary and writing styles.

Our expectation is that each child reads at least three times a week at home, please remember to initial their reading journal when they have read.

SPAG

Children will be set spellings to learn each week. These are important steps towards being able to spell the statutory words they will need to use in their writing on a daily basis.

Spellings will be sent home and tested on a Monday so please ensure your child has their book in school to practise and collect their spellings.

Science

Our second unit on our PKC Science journey is Cycles in Nature. This unit will help us to understand the changes of the seasons and life cycles of plants and animals.

<u>History</u>

This term the children learning about the Ancient Egyptians.

<u>Geography</u>

Art this term will focus on Still life—we will use the skills that we learnt last term to draw objects that we can see.
