

School Round Up

The month of December is now upon us and we are more than half way into the term. The next few weeks are extremely busy with different events and trips - please ensure you have looked at the Diary Dates, and are checking the updates that are sent out. The school has been decorated and we are all looking forward to Christingle on Friday; this has to be my favourite service. The children will be making their Christingles in school on Friday morning, and it is always a magical experience when those who have never been to a Christingle are holding their lit one later in the day. We are still planning to walk to the church and will arrive in time for a 2pm start, please do come and join us, all are welcome! If you aren't able to attend, please remember to pick up your child from the church at 3pm. Any children that are at club or in wraparound will be walked back to school by staff.

The classrooms have been very busy, and we are starting to see the impact of some recent Professional Development being utilised. The staff have had some extra training on using Purple Mash, and incorporating this into both the Computing curriculum and across the other subjects. The children all have log ins to Purple Mash and can access this from home, so do please explore with your children.

Mrs Moore has also been in classes over the past week, checking on the High Quality teaching of English. The Class Ambassadors have been tasked with seeking pupil voice about the subject and will be feeding that back to Mrs Moore, so that she can use this alongside book looks and observations to inform future developments in the subject.

We have now moved into Advent, and through Collective Worship the children are learning about the importance of this time to Christians, through a Jesse Tree.

The Jesse Tree is a Christmas tradition used for Advent, where a "family tree" of Jesus is built through stories and ornaments representing figures and events from the Bible. Each day of Advent, a new ornament is hung on a tree (or a branch), accompanied by a reading from the Old Testament that connects to Jesus's lineage, and the tradition builds anticipation for his birth.

The children will add to the Jesse Tree each day, alongside the opening of the Advent calendar, and hopefully appreciate more the meaning behind it, and know that Advent is not just about the chocolate!

The Class Ambassadors met last week, and reflected upon Children in Need. They were really pleased with the £79 that was donated, and the toast was well received. They were also challenged to make suggestions of what could be done better next time, so watch this space! The Sports Leaders have been very busy putting their list together of new equipment - hopefully Miss Thorne and I will say yes to their requests!

Attendance Matters



Attendance is slowly beginning to rise again, hopefully the period of illness is starting to come to an end, we are certainly seeing more children with 100% attendance across the weeks.

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Class News

Wright

We are enjoying our learning about journeys – the children are busily creating rafts and testing if they float and can carry our compare bears across the water tray. We are plodding on with our phonics sessions and beginning to write words with increasing independence in our writing books.

We love mastery of number and our maths sessions – learning about how numbers to 5 are made and being able to count securely will help us as we grow. We are learning about shapes – if you are out and about and spot shapes in the environment please share with your children – it will help them to cement their learning by anchoring it in their own environments.

The children in Wright Class have said, 'I like building letters and numerals with the lego,' 'I like looking at the frost outside,' 'I enjoyed exploring transport from the past – thinking about how we could carry our shopping home on a horse with a bag either side,' and 'I like making rafts and testing them to see if they float.'

Armstrong

We have started our writing about Peter Pan, after a small set back. Not many of our pupils are familiar with the story, and so we did watch the film alongside our reading of the text. We are hoping by the end of next week to have re-written the story for ourselves, I wonder what little snippets or added details they might include! Hopefully, they will be showing their new knowledge of grammar through the word choices they make.

The children have achieved really well in Maths so far, and have shown they are really starting to master Column Addition including regrouping from one column to the next! We wait to see if they will have the same success with Column Subtraction!

In Design Technology, we are starting to see their key ring designs coming to life; they have worked hard on their sewing skills, and use a few different stitches. The final appliques just need to be added over the coming weeks. We will finish the term with some Festive Cooking!

Peake

We are busy bees in Peake class, ensuring we get all of our learning done so that we can enjoy the Christmas festivities towards the end of the term.

The children have been enjoying their English lessons so far, which link well to our science topic of animals and their needs. They are working towards creating a care guide for a pet dog using both their knowledge of animals from science, and their grammatical and sentence skills from English.

In art, we are enjoying using different types of line to make pictures inspired from artists like Miro, Klee and Pwerle. We are eager to update our art gallery in our classroom to showcase our skills of line we have learnt.

The children have really taken interest in our history lessons, as for our Year 1 pupils, this is the first time they have encountered History before at school. There has been some really detailed pieces of writing about Mary Seacole, whom is one of the significant figures we have spent time learning about. We are excited to learn more about the past over the next few weeks.

Vancouver

Vancouver Class are enjoying a busy half-term, we will soon be finishing the writing of our George and the Dragon stories and are feeling proud of all our creative ideas.

We're now excited to start producing our cam toys in DT, and we'll also be making clay tiles decorated with Islamic patterns as part of our art topic.

Even more exciting, we're looking forward to taking part in the Future Stars programme with the University of East Anglia — including a special trip to the campus!

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Sports Update

Thank you to all who are attending the Daily Mile, we are now starting to encourage the children to jog and run their 8 laps. Since returning from the half term break the children are now expected to jog from the trim trail to the tyres near the gate, we will increase this as the year goes on.

Just a reminder that for the children to receive their stamp for the mile they must arrive at 8:20am, all children are welcome to join after 8:20am but they will not get a stamp on their Daily Mile chart. Some children are approaching 50 miles and will be rewarded with their certificate once they achieve it. The weather has now changed so a change of shoes and socks will be needed even if the children are in PE kits.

Can we please remind you that the equipment on the field should not be used during the Daily Mile. If you are early and your children are not participating in the Daily Mile, they need to be supervised by yourselves - we are seeing more and more children playing on the front playground with nobody watching them - there are lots of hazards, and the ground is much icier. Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
