Spelling

Children will be set spelling each week. These need to be practiced at home in preparation for their weekly spelling test on Mondays.

The homework set in Peake class focuses mainly on reading, spelling and times table practice. By the end of year two, children are expected to know their 2, 5 and 10x tables, so it is crucial that children start practising throughout year one and two.

In addition to the above, children should complete one the following enrichment tasks each week. This will be set on a Friday with the expectation that it is handed in by the following Friday. Children can earn an extra sticker by handing their homework in earlier than Friday. They will also have a treat if their homework is completed on time and if they have read three times at home over the course of the week.

English

Write a diary entry of what you got up to at the weekend. Remember to use the past tense e.g. went, saw, played, ate

English

Imagine you are in a magical forest. Write a sequence of sentences to help me envision what it is like to be there, think of your 5 senses and use plenty of adjectives (describing words)

Maths- Year 1

Practise drawing some arrays to solve simple multiplication questions in the 2, 5 and 10x tables. You could also practise logging on and accessing Tackling Tables in preparation for using it in school.

Maths- Year 2

Spend some time on tackling tables. Spend at least 15 minutes on play or learn and do at least 2 tests on both multiplication and division.

Science

Our topic is caring for the earth- part of looking after our planet is recycling. See if you can design and/ or make a model out of some rubbish you otherwise will have thrown away. Even better if you create something that is useful!

RE

Find out and create a fact file about one of the following religions: Christianity, Islam, Judaism or Sikhism. Make sure you include information about prayer.

History

Create a wanted poster for King John I, detailing why the Barons were unhappy.



Art

Have a go at recreating Van Gogh's Starry Night. You can use whatever materials you have at home or you could complete it electronically.



PE

Make time for some physical activity for each day of the week and record this as a 'movement diary'. Examples could include star jumps, dance party, homemade obstacle course, Simon says, stretches/ yoga before bed etc

Computing

Count the types of toys you have (dolls, cars, jigsaws etc) and create a block diagram on Purple Mash to show your findings.
