Spelling

Children will be set spellings each week. These need to be practiced at home in preparation for their weekly spelling test on Mondays.

All children will be expected to read at home at least 3 x weekly, practise spellings, access Tackling Tables to practise and test at least 3 x weekly. Homework will be 'set' on a Friday with the expectation that it is handed in by the following Thursday.

In addition to the above, children should complete one the following enrichment tasks each week with the expectation that all English and Maths tasks will be completed over the half term.

English

Write a diary entry about Christmas Day, Christmas Eve or Boxing Day.
(2 paragraphs, 4-6 sentences in each)

English

Write a short report about an animal you would find in the UK.
(3 sections—describe it, describe its habitat, key facts)

Maths

Have a go at subtraction with exchange—at least 10 calculations
Yr3—3 digit numbers
Yr4—4 digit numbers

Maths

Find 6 different 2D shapes in your house—how many sides and corners do they have.

Find 6 different 3D shapes—how many faces, edges and vertices do they have

Science

Investigate shadows. You may choose to create and draw shadows using different objects. You may choose to investigate shadows of objects at different distances from a light source.

History

Investigate Anglo Saxon places names google this with your grown up.
Can you find examples around Norfolk?

Geography

Draw and label the parts of a river
OR
Find out about a local or global river, sharing facts in an interesting way.

Art

Create your own art inspired by Ancient Egypt.

PE

Make a plan of a day to show how you can keep healthy both physically and mentally.

Search for a given animal—record 5 key facts you find.
