Maths

This half-term, we will be finishing our learning on using formal written methods for addition and subtraction and applying this method to solving word problems.

We will then be moving onto using short and long multiplication so practicing times tables will be essential. Within this block of learning, we will also learn about multiples, and factors of numbers as well as prime numbers.

English


We will begin with another narrative unit, where we will focus on sharpening our descriptive skills when we describe the dragon that our protagonist St George later goes on to defeat.

We will then go on to create our very own dragons, which we then write detailed reports about for our own Book of Dragonology

Reading

We will be continuing with our Whole Class Reading approach to teaching reading. During dedicated Reading lessons, the children will engage with extracts from a wide range of books. This enables the children to dip their toes into a range of books as well as encounter a rich range of vocabulary and writing styles.





SPAG

Children will be set spellings to learn each week. These are important steps towards being able to spell the statutory words they will be tested on in Year 6. Therefore, please encourage your child to practise these words regularly.



Science

Our topic this half term is
Materials. We will explore how
some materials can dissolve into
a liquid and how this process
can be reversed to recover a
substance from a solution. We
will also explore methods of
separation methods, including
filtering, sieving and
evaporating.

<u>RE</u> Does Creativity Matter? (Art)

In this unit, pupils will explore the relationship between being human and being creative.

Through engaging
with a range of
religious
traditions,
practices and
texts, pupils will

explore the role of art in expressing identity, belief and belonging.

PE

History-The Transatlantic Slave Trade

During this unit, we will build upon our knowledge of empire and slavery. We will look at the shocking history of the Transatlantic Slave Trade, learning how and why the forced migration of millions of Africans took place. With carefully chosen primary and secondary sources, we will learn about how enslaved Africans were treated, what conditions were like on the 'Atlantic Passage' and what life was like for enslaved Africans who worked on the plantations.

<u>Geography</u> Mountains

Building on children's understanding of natural landforms, children will study mountains in depth in this unit. We will be looking at world maps and relief maps to identify mountain ranges as well as encountering new

PSHE

This half term, we will be learning the key characteristics of bullying; developing, exploring and applying definitions of bullying to a range of situations including cyberbullying. Alongside this, we will also be focusing our learning around developing an understanding and recognition of our emotions and those of others, including how we might express and respond to those feelings.

Computing

Game Creator

This unit allows children to learn more about the world of gaming.
Children will design and make their own 3D maze adventure game on Purple Mash, assessing the effectiveness of their own and other's creations.



Art Islamic Art and Architecture

We begin this unit by studying the Dome of the Rock in Jerusalem. We will identify examples of Islamic style, including calligraphy, geometric and vegetal patterns made from tilework and mosaics. We will also look at the Alhambra in detail. During the course of the unit the children create two works of art in Islamic style. A repeating geometric designs which transfer it onto a clay tile.

French

To start this half-term, we will be learning to write a short sequence of sentences about ourselves in French. We will then be moving onto a new unit talking about school including subjects we do and don't like.
