

# $20 \times C \times M \times B \times 26$

## Christus Mansionem Benedicat

(May Christ bless this dwelling place)

very year, it is a tradition on the Feast of the Epiphany, Sunday, January 4th, to bless your home.

We invite you to adopt this custom in your family. The family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance, 20 + C + M + B + 26. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2026 is the year.

#### **Instructions for Blessing the Home**

Using the blessed chalk, located at the usher's tables, mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) as follows: 20 + C + M + B + 26 while saying: The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human over two thousand years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

Then offer the following prayer: Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen

"Chalking the door" is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. With time the chalk will fade. As it fades we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our heart and be manifest in our words and actions the Latin words, *Christus mansionem benedictat*, "May Christ bless the house."

The Second Collection this weekend, January 3 & 4 is for Maintenance & Repair.

#### CONVERSION

We call it **conversion**, the moment when you receive an invitation from Jesus to enter into a personal, loving relationship with Him.

#### **Resources for Personal Growth**

- Complete an examination of conscience regularly (daily, weekly, or monthly) to see how you may need to convert certain parts of your life
- Make a daily examen
- Meet with a Spiritual Director or Mentor
- Look for local opportunities at the parish for catechesis, such as a Bible Study, a formation series, or an upcoming talk
- Use resources from apostolates such as Be Formed, Word on Fire, Formed.org, Heroic Men, Exodus 90, and Ascension
- Go on a retreat, such as an upcoming Cursillo
- Go to a conference or event, such as with Men of Christ


