



Bare Root Fruit & Nut Trees 2026

Apples

Semi-Dwarf will reach about 14-18' in height.



Cosmic Crisp[®] – Red juicy apple. Perfect sweetness and tartness. Excellent eating apple. Semi-dwarf.

Fuji – Sweet-tart flavor, yellowish apple with orange-red blush stripes. Semi-dwarf.

Honeycrisp[®] – Large red apple that is crisp and juicy. Excellent flavor. Stores well. Ripens late September. Semi-dwarf.

Sunrise Magic[®] – Pinkish-red, sweet, moderate acidic apple. A cross between Splendour and Gala. First apple released by WSU. Semi-Dwarf

Combination #1 – **Sunrise Magic**[®] (Pinkish-red, sweet, moderate acidic apple. A cross between Splendour and Gala. First apple released by WSU.), **Honeycrisp**[®] (Large red apple that is crisp and juicy. Excellent flavor. Stores well. Ripens late Sept.), **Gravenstein** (Red striped over yellow, firm, juicy, crisp. All-time favorite. Early fall.), **Cosmic Crisp**[®] (Red juicy apple. Perfect sweetness and tartness. Excellent eating apple.), & **Chehalis** (Large, yellow-green, mild sweet flavor, juicy and crisp eating apple. Scab resistance. Mid-Sept. to early Oct.).

Combination #2 – **Spartan** (Dark red, crisp, excellent flavor. Good storage. Heavy bearing. Mid-Oct.), **Honeycrisp**[®] Large red apple that is crisp and juicy. Excellent flavor. Stores well. Ripens late Sept.), **Chehalis** (Large, yellow-green, mild sweet flavor, juicy and crisp eating apple. Scab resistance. Mid-Sept. to early Oct.), **Akane** (Attractive red “lunch Box” apple. Dessert quality, good to excellent tart, sprightly flavor. Late Aug. to Sept.), & **Liberty** (Red, crisp and juicy. Disease-resistant variety. Oct.). Semi-dwarf.

Combination #3 – **Gala** (Bright scarlet stripe over yellow. Excellent quality. Mildew resistant.), **Honeycrisp**[®] (Large red apple that is crisp and juicy. Excellent flavor. Stores well. Ripens late Sept.), **Braeburn** (Medium size, golden red apple. Excellent flavor, matures late, keeps well.), **Red Macintosh** (Medium to large, bright red with white, tender flesh. Fall.), & **Fuji** (Sweet-tart flavor, yellowish apple with orange-red blush stripes.). Semi-dwarf.

Colonnade Apples

Columnar apple trees, also called 'urban apple trees,' offer a wonderful opportunity to grow your own fresh fruit when you have limited space. With a compact, upright growth habit and only reaching 8-10' high, they are perfect for growing in containers on patios or balconies. Like other apples, you need two different cultivars for pollination.

Golden Sentinal® - Large yellow apples in mid-September. Good for fresh eating or baking. Upright and narrow growth, 8-12'.

Northpole® - Large red fruit, ripening early September. Good for cider, baking, and eating. Upright growth, 8-12'.

Scarlet Sentinal® - Large yellow apple with red blush. Juicy, sweet apple. Good keeper. Late September. Upright and narrow, 8-10'.

Blushing Delight™ Urban Apple® - Sweet flavor and a red blush over a green background. Ripens mid-September. Upright growth, 8-10' tall and 2' wide. Recommended pollinizers would be the Akane Apple or Tasty Red™ Urban Apple®. Highly disease resistant.

Tasty Red™ Urban Apple® - A bright red, firm, sweet, juicy apple that ripens early mid-season. Upright growth, 8-10' tall and 2' wide. Recommended pollinizers: Akane Apple or another Urban Apple®. Highly disease resistant.

Dwarf Cherries

Dwarf will reach about 12-15' in height.

Bing® - Top quality, large juicy and sweet black cherry, needs pollinator. Mid-season. Dwarf.

Glacier® - Large, dark, sweet cherry. Self-fertile. Dwarf.

Montmorency® - Probably the best pie cherry. Sour cherry, small bright red, soft fruit. Juicy with a sweet-tart flavor. Self-fertile. Mid-season. Dwarf.

Rainier® - Beautiful yellow skin with pink blush. Ripens before Bing. Needs pollinator but is a good pollinizer for others. Sweet! Dwarf.

Sweetheart® - Bright red, sweet fruit. Self-fertile. Ripens late July. Dwarf.

Dwarf Combination - **Bing** (Top quality, large juicy and sweet black cherry. Mid-season.), **Rainier** (Beautiful yellow skin with pink blush. Ripens before Bing. Good pollinizer. Sweet!), **Van** (Black shiny fruit, firmer and slightly smaller than Bing and ripens about the same time. Heavy bearing and a good pollinizer.), **Montmorency** (Pie-cherry, sweet-tart flavor. Mid-season.), **Stella** (Red, sweet cherry. Mid-season), & **Sweetheart** (Self-fertile. Bright red, sweet fruit).



European & Japanese Plums

Semi-dwarf will reach about 15-18' in height.

Dwarf will reach about 12-15' in height.

Japanese plum varieties tend to bloom and reach harvest earlier. They also have a higher water content, therefore are very plump and juicy, making them good for eating fresh. European plum varieties contain less water, have firmer flesh and more soluble solids, making them good candidates for being dried, canned, or made into jams or jellies.

Brooks Plum – Early Italian strain, purple. Semi-dwarf.

Hollywood Plum – Japanese type, Two inch wide red plums with red flesh of good quality. Good for eating and makes excellent jelly. Showy pink bloom and purple leaves. Semi-dwarf.

Imperial Epineuse – European type, medium sized oval fruit, purple-blue skin, yellow flesh, freestone, firm, sweet, great for fresh eating and drying. Very productive. Mid-August. Semi-dwarf.

Italian Prune – European type, medium, purplish-black sweet fruit. Excellent fresh, canned or dried. Late-mid season. Semi-dwarf.

Yellow Egg Plum – European type, large, oval, bright yellow skin and yellow flesh. Soft and sweet. Mid-season. Semi-dwarf.

Combination – **Stanley** (Large purplish black with yellow flesh. Sweet, juicy. Mid-season, good canning.), **Yellow Egg** (Large oval, bright yellow with yellow flesh. Soft and sweet. Mid-season.), **Brooks** (Early Italian strain, purple.), **Italian Prune** (Medium, purplish black, sweet. Excellent flesh, canned or dried. Late mid-season.), **Seneca** (Large purple fruit. High quality for eating, canning or drying, resists cracking.), & **Green Gage** (Medium, round, greenish yellow with amber flesh. Sweet, good flavor, good for eating, cooking, canning, or jam. Mid-season.).

European Pears

Semi-dwarf will reach about 14-18' in height.



Bartlett Pear – Medium to large thin-skinned, very sweet and tender. Excellent eating and canning. Early Sept. Semi-dwarf.

Orcas Pear – Large, sweet mild flavor, good for canning and drying. September ripening. Semi-dwarf.

Combination – **Bartlett** (Medium to large thin-skinned, very sweet and tender. Excellent eating and canning. Early Sept.), **Flemish Beauty** (Medium to large, yellow with red blush, good canner. Just after Bartlett.), **Red Bartlett** (Like Bartlett except bright red skin and somewhat sweeter.), **Rescue** (Large, sweet mild flavor, orange-yellow skin and good producer. Late Aug.), **Anjou** (Medium to large, fine flavor, good keeper. Mid-late ripening.), & **Bosc** (Medium to large very sweet, tender. Excellent eating and canning. Early Sept.).

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Asian Pears

Most Asian pears are self-fertile and tend to over produce when cross-pollinated. Thin fruit out to one per cluster to produce larger fruit. You can cross-pollinate late blooming Asian pears with early blooming European pears.

Nijisseiki – Medium round, greenish yellow, firm, crisp and juicy, good quality. Late August.

Shinglo – Golden brown skin, ripens early August. Average size, sweet, juice, excellent flavor.

Shinseiki – Medium round, yellow-skinned, crisp and juicy. Mid-August.

Combination – Chojuro (Medium round, brown-skinned, mildly sweet, texture firm and crisp. Mid-Aug.), **Nijiseiki** (Medium round, greenish yellow, firm, crisp and juicy, good quality. Late Aug.), **Shinseiki** (Medium round, yellow-skinned, crisp and juicy. Mid-Aug.), **Shinko** (Brown-skinned, crisp, sweet to sub-acid. Mid-Oct.), & **Kosui** (Medium to large, brown-skinned, crisp, sweet spicy and aromatic. Mid-Sept.).

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Apple #1 – Honeycrisp® (Large red apple that is crisp and juicy. Excellent flavor. Stores well. Ripens late Sept.), **Sunrise Magic**® (Pinkish-re, sweet, moderate acidic apple. A cross between Splendour and Gala. First apple released by WSU.), & **Cosmic Crisp**® – Red juicy apple. Perfect sweetness and tartness. Excellent eating apple. Semi-dwarf).

Apple #2 – Fuji (Sweet-tart flavor, yellowish apple with orange-red blush stripes.), **Gala** (Bright scarlet stripe over yellow. Excellent quality. Mildew resistant.), & **Honeycrisp**® (Large red apple that is crisp and juicy. Excellent flavor. Stores well. Ripens late Sept.).

European Pear – Bartlett (Medium to large thin-skinned, very sweet and tender. Excellent eating and canning. Early Sept.), **Bosc** (Medium to large, long-necked, fine flavor. Mid-season.), & **Red Bartlett** (Like Bartlett except bright red skin and somewhat sweeter.).

Oriental Pear – Chojuro (Medium round, brown-skinned, mildly sweet, texture firm and crisp. Mid-August), **Nijiseiki** (Medium round, greenish yellow, firm, crisp and juicy, good quality. Late Aug.), **Shinseiki** (Medium round, yellow-skinned, crisp and juicy. Mid-Aug.).

Peaches

Semi-dwarf will reach about 15-18' in height.

Frost Peach® - Medium to large fruit, yellow flesh, freestone. Good quality fruit and good producer. Ripens mid-August, self-fertile. Still the best leaf curl resistant peach tree available. Semi-dwarf.

Red Haven – Free stone, medium size, yellow flesh, great canning and freezing peach. Semi-Dwarf



Apricots

Semi-Dwarf will reach about 15-18' in height.

Puget Gold® Apricot – Medium size, firm flesh, and sweet fruit, mid-August, self-fertile.

Scout Apricot – Hardy to Zone 3 with pink flowers. Bronze-gold fruit with red blush in August. Good for canning, jam, or eating. Self-fertile.

Quince

Semi-Dwarf will reach about 12-15' in height.

Pineapple Quince – Round yellow fruit, ripening in October. Pineapple-like flavor. Ideal for making jellies, cooking, and adding to apple cider. Self-fertile. Hardy to Zone 6.

Special Combinations!

Fruit Cocktail – Frost Peach® (Leaf curl resistant. Medium to large fruit, yellow flesh, freestone, good quality and producer. Mid-Aug, self-fertile.), **Puget Gold Apricot** (Medium size, firm flesh, and sweet fruit. Mid-Aug, self-fertile.), **Hardy Red Nectarine** (New promising variety for the Northwest. Red skinned with golden blush, yellow flesh. Ripens mid-Aug. Excellent flavor.), **Rainier Cherry** (Beautiful yellow skin with pink blush. Mid-season.), **Italian Prune** (Medium, purplish-black sweet fruit. Excellent fresh, canned or dried. Mid-late season.), **Lapin Cherry** (Self-fertile. Dark red, crack resistant cherry. Sweet and juicy.)

Fruit Salad – Frost Peach® (Leaf curl resistant. Medium to large fruit, yellow flesh, freestone, good quality and producer. Mid-Aug, self-fertile.), **Puget Gold Apricot** (Medium size, flesh firm, sweet, susceptible to common apricot problems. Mid-Aug, self-fertile.), **Hardy Red Nectarine** (New promising variety for the Northwest. Red skinned with golden blush, yellow flesh. Ripens mid-Aug. Excellent flavor.), **Harcot Apricot** (Sweet juicy, rich flavor. Great for colder areas with its frost-hardy late bloom.), **Nadia Plum** (50/50 Plum/Cherry Hybrid. High levels of antioxidants. Stores well.), & **Shiro Plum** (Yellow, juicy, sweet. Good producer).



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Almonds

Semi-Dwarf will reach about 15 – 18' in height.

Hall's Hardy – Hardy and heavy producer of large sized, soft-shell nuts. Self-fertile. Late.

Texas Mission – Upright, vigorous grower, produces small hard-shelled nuts. Partially self-fertile, provide a pollinator for a larger crop. Late.

Filberts

Jefferson – Upright growth. Produces the leading nut in the market, medium size. Very high resistance to eastern filbert bight. Late.

Sacajawea – Upright, rounded habit. Produces small high-quality nuts that fall from the husks. Late.

Walnuts

Carpathian – Cold hardy strain of the English walnut. Thinner shells make them easier to shell. Partially self-pollinating. Late.

Manregion – A hardy English walnut that produces medium size nuts with a sweet, rich flavor. Partially self-pollinating. Late.
