You Don't Need a Title to Be a Leader

As November brings us a season of gratitude and reflection, I find myself thinking about what leadership truly means at **Hiawatha Homes**. I spoke to a DSP recently at a house and she said that she was trying to work hard at the tasks to get promoted. I shared with her that what we look for is **Leadership**. Leadership isn't defined by hard work, job titles, or hierarchy; it's defined by integrity, being trustworthy, authenticity, taking initiative, and the courage to do what's right. Being on time, respectful, working together and completing tasks are expecting, but there is more. I want to share a parable, a teaching story, that captures this idea.

A retiring President of a company gathered their leadership team together for a special meeting and gave each person a small pot with soil and a seed. "Plant it, care for it, and bring back what grows in a year," the CEO said. Throughout the year one woman was anxious and worried when her plant failed to grow. Her and her husband tried different fertilizers, more and less sunlight and water, but nothing worked; the plant never grew. The day came when she had to bring the plant in for judging.

The room was filled with vibrant plants, beautiful flowers, lush green leaves, all except one, hers. Hers was a pot of empty soil. She was embarrassed but honest, explaining that no matter how hard she tried, her seed never sprouted. The President walked around the room and stopped in front of her pot and stopped, smiled, and announced: "You don't know this, but the seeds I gave you were boiled, they couldn't grow. Every one of you replaced your seeds to make them grow. Looking at the woman he said, "You were the only one with the courage to bring back the truth. Congratulations, you're my successor."

This story reminds us that true leadership isn't measured by position or recognition. It's revealed through the choices we make every day. At Hiawatha Homes, each of you leads in your own way:

- When you show patience in a challenging moment.
- When you bring calm to chaos.
- When you speak up for what's right.
- When you treat the individuals we support with respect, compassion, and dignity.

Those moments, often unseen, are where real leadership grows.


