CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at the hour of 7:00 PM by Mayor David Gray. The Mayor led the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES, RECEIPTS & DISBURSEMENTS FROM JULY 15TH, 2024.

Mayor Gray called for a motion of approval for the July 15th, 2024 Meeting Minutes, Receipts and Disbursements. A motion was made by Councilwoman Toni Jackson and seconded by Councilman Kevin Collins and duly carried to accept as read.

NEW BUSINESS:

Attorney Chelsey Brammell led with the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2024-04 Imposing Ad Valorem Taxes.

Mayor Gray asked Attorney Brammell to have the 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2024-03 Repealing Ordinance Number 2014-01 and Establishing a Comprehensive Dog Licensing and Animal Control Ordinance. Councilwoman Toni Jackson made a motion to approve Ordinance 2024-03 Repealing Ordinance Number 2014-01 and Establishing a Comprehensive Dog Licensing and Animal Control Ordinance. Councilman Kevin Collins seconded her motion and all duly accepted.

Mayor Gray asked Community Center Director, Angela Gray if she would like to address the council. The Director wanted to inform the Council of the date for Boo Bash, set for October 26, 2024. She also informed them that the festivities would end an hour earlier this year as well as she would be cutting back the time on the games. She expressed the need for more volunteers than we have had in the past. She stated that having the Haunted City Hall takes lots of manpower, along with bounciers, vendors, petting zoo and games. Mrs. Gray asked for any recommendations of how we could improve the event. No suggestions were given.

Mayor Gray stated that a motion was needed to add the City Clerk, Kim Boyer and himself to the lockbox and CD's at United Citizens Bank and Trust and furthermore remove Kimmie Jewell as well as Gabe O'Nan. Councilman John Suter made a motion to remove Kimmie Jewell and Gabe O'Nan from the Lockbox located at United Citizens Bank and Trust Company as well as all CD's listed in the name of City of Campbellsburg and to add the current City Clerk, Kim Boyer as well as the current Mayor, David Gray. Councilman Kevin Collins seconded her motion and all duly accepted.

OLD BUSINESS

Dumpster day will take place October 5th, 2024. Mayor Gray asked for suggestions for times that council thought that citizens would engage. Councilman Garold Price suggested 9:00am-1:00pm. All agreed. Discussion was also had that there would be no acceptance of tires, paint, or chemicals etc.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Gray announced that he spoke with everyone individually on the Medical Cannabis decision and all were in agreement to allow it. There will need to be an Ordinance passed. Attorney Brammell stated that stipulations will need to be included in the Ordinance. No allowances within 1000 feet of a church or school etc. She also suggested that the City considers getting a Conditional Use Permit allowing the Henry County Board of Adjustments to have control. This has to be passed and published by the end of the Calendar Year.

Mayor Gray addressed the issue published in the local newspaper that the City of Pleasureville is considering using our Established Code Enforcement Board for their appeals. Attorney Brammell suggested that they look into what we have established so the Mayor and the City Clerk will ask to be put on the agenda for September and answer their questions.


Mayor Gray stated that the caution light had been fixed finally. Kentucky Utilities was supposed to be out to reconnect the electricity this Tuesday.

Lastly, the Mayor addressed the concerns that have been reported back to him regarding Public Works Director, William Brown mowing citizens yards for personal gain. He asked the Council that if they hear the rumors to have them call the City Hall and talk with the Mayor. He asks Mr. Brown to mow those yards that are a hazard for the surrounding citizens and in turn places a lien on the said property. Under no condition is there anything to gain privately by doing this. This is to protect the citizens of Campbellsburg. He also stated that as soon as he gets the property across from the cemetery approved for demolition, that trailer will be gone.


