7. Mayor's Report:

Mayor Gray announced that the Campbellsburg Fire Department had fulfilled the contract through June 30, 2025. The city had paid the \$20,000 in full.


Mayor stated that the deep freeze was installed by the Fish and Wildlife Department. Details will come once the season starts on how the program works.

The Mayor commended the Police Department on helping the Elementary school in the mornings with the drop off lines. They have been a huge help.


He wanted to clarify that the cemetery transfer was simply that. The city did not pay \$75,000. That was just the value for recording purposes.
