CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at the hour of 7:03 PM by Mayor David Gray. The Mayor led the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES, RECEIPTS & DISBURSEMENTS FROM MAY 19TH, 2025 MEETING

Mayor Gray called for a motion of approval for the May 19th, 2025 Meeting Minutes, Receipts and Disbursements. A motion was made by Councilwoman Toni Jackson and seconded by Councilman Kevin Collins and duly carried to accept as read.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor Gray began by explaining the need for the Resolution that he was about to read. This was the city's second attempt at applying for the COPS Hiring Program (CHP) only this time we are at the aid of KIPDA (Kentuckiana Regional Planning and Development Agency). After meeting with grant writers of KIPDA, they have hit the ground running helping us establish a School Resource Officer at Campbellsburg Elementary then hopefully keep the officer in our Police Department. Mayor Gray continued to read the Resolution of the City Council Relating to a COPS hiring Program (CHP) Application. Councilwoman Jessica Mayse made a motion to accept the Resolution as read, Councilman Kevin Collins seconded the motion and all were in favor.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Councilwoman Toni Jackson made a comment to the Mayor and Council that the newly installed LED sign looks great. Her comment sparked conversation of public comments good and bad. Mayor Gray explained that he and his staff were training on the specs of the lighting June 17th at 5:00pm and to learn to adjust, tweak, add, anything there is to know about the sign.

Mayor Gray informed the Council that he, public works director Bill Brown, and city clerk Kim Boyer, attended the KLC Code enforcement/Economic Development Conferences last week. It was informative as always. He learned that he as Mayor will need to go and recruit businesses to join our community himself.



Adjournment:


