APPROVAL OF MINUTES, RECEIPTS & DISBURSEMENTS FROM FEBRUARY 19TH, 2024 MEETING

Mayor Gray called for a motion of approval for the February 19th, 2024 Meeting Minutes, Receipts and Disbursements. Before a motion was made Councilwoman Toni Jackson inquired about a monthly charge to You Tube TV and Mayor Gray explained that the charge had been posting well over a year and that it was for the television/entertainment at the Community Center and that the Council had previously approved it. A motion was then made by Councilwoman Toni Jackson and seconded by Councilwoman Aundrea Selter and duly carried to accept as read.

NEW BUSINESS:

Kim Goodloe With Merriweather and King Street School Fund addressed the council stating that the African American School was soliciting funds to renovate the original school and they were considering several options after completion to encourage tourism. Museum, Gift Shop, etc. They intend to do fundraising and they are asking for ½ (half) of \$21,000 for interior renovations and Financial Assistance. Councilwoman Toni Jackson asked Mr. Goodloe for a date anticipated to be opened and his reply was as soon as possible and that pictures were available online.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Gray asked Todd McKinney if he had anything to report from the Economic Development Committee and he said that the next meeting was the following night and that affordable housing has talked about coming closer to I-71.

Mayor Gray stated that the Sewer Project is complete. Kaleb said that they have a grinder station to make some adjustments to. Other than that, it is a go. There is no waiting list to tie on to the sewer.

Councilwoman Toni Jackson asked about the Street Lights that were out. Mayor Gray responded that he had gone around marking the poles with lights out and that Kentucky Utilities had started the replacements of the lights however, some of those are Shelby Rural Electric Company's customers and that we would need to contact them.

Councilwoman Toni Jackson asked where citizens could go in the event of a weather related event such as a tornado. Councilman John Suter and the Mayor agreed that most of the churches within the city normally open up for shelter.

Mayor Gray asked if anyone had suggestions for the Grand Marshall for Campbellsburg Day 2024. The Mayor's choice was John Suter's mom and dad. Councilman stated that he would ask them and let the Mayor know. The Mayor reported that several food vendors had already responded. BYB will be bringing the Petting Zoo but the rides are questionable due to the manpower to watch them. He explained that we have tried to get high school students in the past but it was difficult to get commitments to show up.

Lastly, Mayor Gray reported that 6 Code Enforcement Violation Letters were sent last month and all 6 were making efforts to comply.

Councilman John Suter asked if anyone knew what the alarm type or beeping sound he is hearing coming from the grey house next to the old school house. No one seems to know.

Adjournment:


The motion was made by Councilman William Brown and seconded by Councilman Kevin Collins and duly carried to stand in adjournment at the hour of 7:22 PM.
