I would like to congratulate our thirteen (13) inductees in the National Junior Honor Society Service Club. This club is designed to create higher enthusiasm for community service, stimulate a desire to create, develop and lead service activities and encourage good citizenship in students in 7th and 8th grade as good stewards of young Catholics. Lead by teacher facilitator, Mrs. Jenkin, and student president, Atticus Yarso, the club seeks to serve others not only in our school, but in our community. Being in the club is both an honor and a commitment. The students are expected to continue to demonstrate the qualities of scholarship, leadership, service, and citizenship. Those students who wanted to join the NJHS are asked to complete an essay explaining why they would like to be considered for induction into the Service Club. Simple submission of an essay does not guarantee admittance to the club. The essay includes a little about the student, service activities the student has done in the past, and activities they would like to lead, develop, and carry out. We are excited to see these young men and ladies grow in their Faith as they become leaders of tomorrow.

Chartwells, the Archdiocesan lunch program, is initiating newer meal choices and fun "tasting" days to not only excite the lunch program but get feed back on newer food items to see if the lunch program should bring those items into their regular menu. Fr. Craig Giera, who serves as the Director of Priestly Vocations, will visit Immaculate Conception next Thursday, October 30. Fr. Craig Marion, who is a parish priest at St. Ephrem Parish, Sterling Heights, leads the archdiocese's efforts to encourage men to consider the priesthood and young women into the consecrated life. He will concelebrate with Fr. Esper at the 8:30 Thursday Mass. Only seventh and eighth grades will attend this Mass (along with regular parish weekly attendees) followed by a Q&A from Fr. Craig back at the school. The whole school will attend regular Friday Mass, the next day, on Halloween.

Due to Halloween landing on a Friday, Fr. Esper has agreed to a *Black and Orange* dress down for Halloween even (though it is a Mass day). The grade hosting the Mass, those participants, are asked to wear their Mass attire and may change afterwards. Speaking of Halloween, please make sure to check your child's teacher's communications regarding Halloween activities and all other activities that will be involved in that day. Thank you, classroom liaisons, for helping teachers organize this day of celebration!

Please note, All Saints Day falls on Saturday, November 1. Mass at Immaculate Conception will be held at 9:00 a.m. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven. A little background, "All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints. The choice of the day may have been intended to co-opt the pagan holiday "Feast of the Lamures," a day which pagans used to placate the restless spirits of the dead. The holy day was eventually established on November 1 by Pope Gregory III in the mid-eighth century as a day dedicated to the saints and their relics. The May 13 celebration was subsequently abandoned". (catholic.org)


