



The new year brings expectations of resolutions that most of the time are never kept. May we keep the promise of a new day to


start over in grace and love for others, as well as ourselves.



Some churches in your community may offer Blue Christmas services to acknowledge your worries and give you support for hope and healing.


It is comforting to know <u>you are not alone</u> and that others are there to support you and that <u>God cares for you</u>.








Arborists Jonathan Nichols and Daniel Hemphill removed the five Boxelder trees, which had significant decay and damage caused by squirrels and bees/hornets. Afterward, our team worked together to load trailers and pickup trucks with branches smaller than 10" in diameter. Over the following week, many people responded to Facebook posts and word of mouth to pick up the larger pieces.


Although we will miss these large trees, removing them helped prevent future safety and liability issues. As John noted, "If these trees were anywhere besides around a church, they would have already fallen over."


