CEMETERY INFORMATIONAL BROCHURE

Hours

- Open 7 am to one half hour after sunset.
- Winter access will be limited due to snow amounts. The cemetery will not be plowed during winter months.
- Except for service dogs or medically required animals, general pets are not allowed.

Prohibited Conduct

- No advertising.
- Rubbish and debris is to be placed in receptacles provided.
- Vehicles driven only on established roads using a 8 mph speed limit.
- No consuming of alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs on the property for either the living or the dead.

Monuments, Markers & Foundations

- No artificial stone, wood or stainless steel monuments.
- All cremains must be in an urn or box.

Plantings

- Any trees, bushes, ornamental trees or shrubs must be requested in writing.
- Any flower annuals or plants must be in urns or pots placed flush with monument.
- Shepherd hooks must be flush with monument and plant must be hanging over the headstone as to not interfere with cemetery maintenance.
- Responsibility for proper maintenance of all lawns, trees and shrubs within the cemetery grounds will be in the realm of cemetery maintenance personnel. Discretion by personnel to remove unsightly, overgrown or in any way causing unsafe conditions will be addressed. The cemetery personnel bears no responsibility for the maintenance of memorials, grave decoration damage, lost or removed.

Decorations April 1st through Sept. 30th

- Statuary are limited to: the Blessed Virgin Mary, Jesus, saints and angels.
- Prohibited Decorations: For the safety of our visitors and maintenance staff, breakable, hazardous or other items that interfere with cleaning or maintenance will be removed. Examples include but are not limited to: pictures, figurines, curios, glassware, votive candles or lights, fishing lures, toys, pin wheels, Christmas trees, plaques, solar powered spinning toys, small trinkets, wind chimes, pop bottles or alcoholic bottles.

Decorations Nov. 1st. through April 1st

 Grave blankets or wreaths will be permitted each year on graves starting November 1st.
 All grave blankets and wreaths will be removed in the spring when weather permits.
