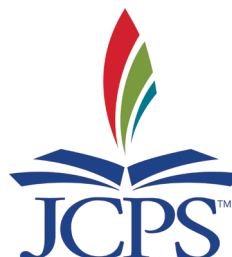

## D.O.S.S. YOUTH SERVICES CENTER

### WHAT IS THE YOUTH SERVICES CENTER (YSC)?

YSCs were created as part of the Kentucky Education Reform Act (KERA) and are located in selected middle and high schools. Centers are designed to enhance students' abilities to succeed in school by helping to eliminate barriers that interfere with learning. Each center offers a unique blend of services determined by the needs of the students and families being served by the center, available resources, location, and other local characteristics. YSCs are links to families, schools, and communities.

### WHO OPERATES THE YSC?

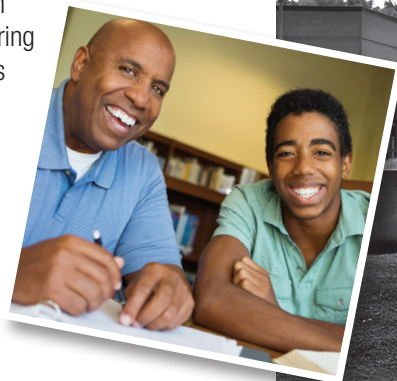
The D.O.S.S. (Doing Our School Service) YSC is managed by a full-time coordinator. The center is governed by an Advisory Council that consists of parents, school staff, community representatives, and students. The council meets every other month to discuss issues that are important to the Doss High School community and to provide focus for the D.O.S.S. YSC.

### WHO MAY USE THE CENTER?

The center is available to all students who attend Doss High School and to their parents, guardians, and families.

### WHEN IS THE CENTER OPEN?

The center is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the school year and selected weeks during the summer. Evening hours are available by appointment. You can reach the D.O.S.S. YSC by calling **313-4445**. The center is located on the first floor of the school across from the cafeteria in Room 127.



### HOW CAN YOU GET INVOLVED?

### WHAT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED?

- Referrals to health services and/or social services
- Family crisis assistance and mental health counseling services
- School-based mental health counseling
- Referrals for drug and alcohol abuse prevention and counseling services
- Career counseling and college information
- Summer and part-time job development for students
- Attendance Support and Truancy Diversion Programs
- Collaboration with Doss's Louisville Education and Employment Partnership (LEEP) career planner to provide employment counseling, training, and placement for students
- Peer mediation/Conflict Resolution Program
- Parent resource library
- Opportunities for service learning
- Educational enrichment programs that enhance students' self-esteem and provide leadership opportunities
- Links to home, school, families, and needed services
