Step 3 - Contact:

- Mr Bolt SENCo and Designated Safeguarding Lead
 - Ms Olubitan Deputy Head

Step 4

Contact the Acting Head of School - Ms Cordery

If the concern remains unresolved, move on to step

5.

Step 5 Contact the Executive Principal - Mr Cook.


