Dear Church,

As I said in last Sunday's sermon, we have much to celebrate and to be grateful for this year at Boulevard. Very much, indeed.

However, as I also said, we find ourselves in great financial need as this year draws to a close.

To date, we have received \$900,498.29 in tithes and offerings—which is a remarkable \$63,000 more than we'd received year-to-date last year.

Unfortunately, we still need to receive \$222,000 more in

the month of December in order to meet budget.

As I pointed out on Sunday: we as a church family have averaged \$950,000 in annual tithes and offerings the past 15 years—which is a truly remarkable demonstration of consistency.

However, due to the effect of inflation, \$950,000 in 2025 is the equivalent of \$1.42 million in 2010. Which means, in short, we are trying to maintain the same level of commitment to our missions and ministries goals while operating on nearly \$500,000 less than just 15 years ago.

Thus, we have before us both a challenge and an invitation: we can remain consistent in our annual giving and radically cut back on our church's missions and ministries goals, or we can all commit to giving a little more—endeavoring to catch back up to the giving levels we have strived for in years past.

As your pastor, I am convinced that the glory days of Boulevard Baptist Church lie not just behind us, but ahead of us, too. We have so much to look forward to and be excited about.

So, please consider giving a meaningful year-end gift to our church's missions and ministries this year.

And then, please also consider maintaining your increased financial commitment to Boulevard for calendar year 2026, as well.

We are indeed at an inflection point in our church's rich and storied history. And I am certain that twenty-five years from now, our children and our grandchildren will look back on this moment and say that this year was a watershed year in the Boulevard story. Thus, may we all stretch ourselves a little more, so that the story they'll be telling is one of generosity and faithfulness—of how the sacrifices we made here, now, are the reason they'll still be telling the story here, then.
