Dear Church,

This Sunday is Palm Sunday, the first day of Holy Week. On this day, we remember how the crowds cheered for Jesus, how they screamed Hosannas at his triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

Then, we reflect on how that excitement and ardor gave way so quickly to darkness and betrayal.

As always, our Palm Sunday service will begin with our BBC children entering our sanctuary waving palm fronds, reminding us of the joy and joviality that attended the entry of Jesus that long ago week.

As Holy Week moves forward, though, the tone of the story shifts—and we will have services that capture all of these tonal changes.

On Wednesday, I will be preaching at Mountain Spring Baptist Church (4801 Liberty Hwy, Anderson, SC 29670) at 6:00 p.m., and Mountain Spring has graciously invited all of Boulevard to join their church family in observing this midpoint of the Holy Week journey. I hope you will make plans to come join us.

On Thursday at 6:00 p.m., we will partake of communion together during our Maundy Thursday service, remembering Christ's final meal with his disciples and the commandment of love that he gave them on their final night together.

On Good Friday at 7:00 p.m., we will be joined by members of Mountain Spring Baptist Church for our annual Tenebrae service, in which candles are extinguished in coordination with the setting of the sun—the final candle being extinguished as the sun sets, a powerful symbol for the death of Jesus.

On Saturday, we stay home from church to grieve and lament—just as the earliest disciples did. We reflect on the love Jesus has for us and on the horror and injustice of his ghastly death.

Then, finally, on Easter Sunday, we sing alleluia and we rejoice at the wondrous news that Christ Jesus has been raised from the dead!

Please make plans to participate in all of these services, as each service sounds a different but necessary note, the sum total coming together in a Holy Week harmony that reminds us how sweet the sound of amazing grace really is.

Our mission focus for the month of March is South Main Chapel & Mercy Center. The vision of South Main Chapel & Mercy Center is to be a church that works alongside those dealing with homelessness and poverty. In addition to Sunday morning worship, a fellowship meal is offered each Sunday following the service. Boulevard provided this lunch March 3rd and will serve lunch three more times this year. Services offered during the week include on-site mental health counseling, vocational rehab counseling, nursing care, addiction recovery referrals, transportation and housing assistance and other case management services for over five hundred

individuals in our community. Along with lunches, another way to serve South Main Chapel & Mercy Center is with your musical talents. South Main is always looking for soloists to sing or play during their Sunday morning worship services. This year makes 10 years of South Main Chapel and Mercy center serving a community. We are so grateful for their ministry and the opportunity to partner with them! ~ Lucy




Ron Davis Organ Concert


