Dear Church,

As I write this letter, we are already three weeks into Eastertide, and, as such, I want to make certain that we continue to reflect on the significance of the Easter message: Jesus Christ really *has* been raised from the dead, and, because he has, everything we *think* we understand about reality has undergone—and must continue to undergo—a fundamental alteration. This is the reason that Easter is a *season* (as opposed to a single day): the resurrection is not just an event—it is an event with far-reaching implications.

As such, we will continue to explore in the coming weeks various ways that the resurrection of Jesus turns upside down our understanding of reality and our expectations of what is to come.

On Pentecost, which will take place on May 19, our focus will shift from the implications of Jesus' resurrection to the implications of the Holy Spirit's in-breaking in the here-and-now, and how the Holy Spirit empowers us—like those first disciples—to turn the world upside down.

So: let us not rush past the good news of Easter. Let us instead continue to marvel at what Jesus' resurrection means. And, as we do, let us prepare ourselves to receive the promissory note on the Kingdom that is to come—the Holy Spirit with which we've been sealed until that grand-glorious day, the Holy Spirit that empowers us to be God's change-agents in a hurting and broken world.

Project



Project Ruth provides life-changing opportunities to people living in poverty, especially their Roma (Gypsy) neighbors with an emphasis on children. The Ruth School is the main ministry of Project Ruth and is a fully accredited private school serving grades 0-8. They train parents with classes taught through their Parents' Academy. Project Ruth provides additional adult education and equipment through their Boaz Second Chance Program as well as their Naomi Counseling Center. Through the Gypsy Smith School, Project Ruth empowers the Roma church by training church leaders. Project Ruth has also begun a Reading Caravan, taking books and resources to surrounding villages to promote literacy. When war broke out in Ukraine, Project Ruth opened their

doors to house refugees along with packing and delivering food boxes to Ukraine.

Boulevard has been involved with Project Ruth from its beginning in 1992. Our members helped purchase the lot in Bucharest, Romania, where the Ruth School now stands. Through the years, we have had 29 groups visit the Ruth School with even more contributing time and resources from Anderson to further this ministry. Article VI (proposed) Property Holding

All property of the church shall be for the express purpose of providing for public worship, for Christian education, for congregational fellowship and for benevolent interests which are in harmony with the mission of the church. Therefore, no Boulevard Baptist Church property or part of such property will be dedicated or named for a person or group, in honor or in memory.

Should a serious division among church members occur because of doctrinal beliefs, practices or any other matter, any change in ownership of church property shall be determined by a two-thirds majority vote at a business meeting called for that purpose.
