Their ultimate vision is to get 5,000 children out of poverty and into a thriving life by 2045 focusing specifically on Latin America and the Caribbean. They start working with mom's even before the child is born - offering prenatal education and vitamins. Their centers focus on the first years for the greatest efficiency and effectiveness. Their centers provide nutrition support, social emotional learning, and pediatric care. They have transformational development centers

which work with the family as a whole to provide resources and strengthen the family unit. They also work with migrant children getting them integrated into the school. They currently have a school in Mexico City and Colombia but hope and plan to open more. ~Lucy
