<b>Priority 1:</b> A counselling professional will support pupils displaying anxiety, especially because of COVID-19 and the summer lockdown.	SENCO in conjunction with class teachers will organise cohort for the counsellor. She will attend one day each week for the autumn term. This will be reviewed end autumn term with having a continued need carrying on.	Butterflies Counselling Services	£210 per day X 12  £2520	AP	Pupils will feel safe. <b>Priority 2:</b>	Staff will carry out an immediate assessment of all pupils in phonics. <b>Priority 4:</b> Pupils will recover lost learning from summer term lockdown and be back on track to achieve previously set targets.
