# Wellbeing & Pastoral Care

Our students experience a sense of belonging and 'home' as they form relationships with our caring, professional staff and within our diverse student population. # Our Junior School Difference

With care, compassion and kindness as hallmark qualities, we strive to empower students to become active and engaged learners who are heart-centred individuals.

In preparation for future-focused exploration of the curriculum, our students will come to know and apply our Junior School Learning Behaviours throughout their learning journey. These are evoking curiosity, courage, collaboration and communication in all aspects of College life. These dispositions very much align with the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart values and bring to life the social, cognitive and emotional learning we aim to foster in the Junior School.

Our teachers work in partnership to implement impactful learning across the Key Learning Areas of the Australian Curriculum. Within our learning structure and processes, students will participate in Journey Groups, journeying between our classroom teachers and collaborative ways of working for an expertly delivered HaSS, Science, Visual Arts and Technology curriculum. In Mathematics, learning is focused on developing strong foundations in numbers, through our fluid group structure. Downlands Junior School has a strong focus on reading and this is supported through our explicit teaching and learning within our guided reading rotations.

Downlands Junior School students have access to a variety of co-curricular opportunities. Our students participate in weekly specialist lessons in, Dance, Drama, French and Music. From Year 5, students have access to the Music Immersion program, bringing a love

of music into the home through the learning of an instrument.

All Junior School students can participate in co-curricular activities throughout the year such as various sports, visiting the Rural Centre, accessing the STEM Lab, joining the Dance Troupe and/or Instrumental Ensemble.

We embed the Downlands heart-centred values into every aspect of the Junior School curriculum and with a strong sense of family, we build our learning community to respect and celebrate each other's successes through developing a love of learning in the Downlands Junior School.

#### Developing the Potential of the Whole Child





# Your school home Boarding

Boarding is integral to the Downlands community and our boarders are the heart and soul of the College.

Downlands adopts the family as our model for boarding, and caters for many rural families located throughout Queensland, New South Wales, South Australia and the Northern Territory. The boarding experience is much more than just meals and beds. Downlands provides an environment that promotes growth as an individual, the development of interpersonal skills and access to a wide variety of opportunities and activities that may not otherwise be available.

#### **Boarding options**

Full time, weekday and casual boarding options are available.
Of course, coeducation has the advantage of brothers and sisters being able to stay, live and grow up together. These are memories that

last a lifetime.

As a home away from home for about a quarter of Downlands students, the choice to board is increasing in popularity for farming and other families, with recently refurbished boarding houses.

#### **Tutoring and Mentoring**

A tutoring and mentoring program runs four nights a week during evening study time. Boarders in small groups receive assistance with their homework by tutors employed by the College.

#### **Experienced staff**

For our staff, caring for boarding students is more than a job, it is a vocation. The family is a model for the level of care provided by our professional, dedicated staff, including registered nurses who are available in our Health and

Wellness Centre.

A busy boarder is a happy boarder, and through an energetic Activities Committee, boarding students are kept active with a full calendar of events, such as:

- theme parks
- climbing Tabletop Mountain
- attending sporting events
- rock climbing
- go-karting
- pool parties
- trivia nights
- social events with students attending other boarding schools.

All activities are covered by an inclusive boarding fee and levy, so no-one misses out.


With two boarding houses for girls and three for boys, and with 90 years of experience,

Up to 250 students, along with 15 residential staff call Downlands home during the school term.

There are also three College families who live on-campus on a permanent basis.





# Rural & CAgricultural

Inclusion of rural and agricultural studies has been an integral part of Downlands since 1931. This commitment to country families helps boarders from rural properties adjust to being away from home, as well as providing skills for a future in agriculture.

Agricultural Science is a vital aspect of the Science Curriculum from Year 8 onwards.

A very hands-on subject, it provides Teams (Cattle and Sheep) opportunities for students of all ages to participate in a variety of projects at the 14 hectare on-site farm, including:

- Fencing
- Cattle handling and show preparation
- Beef, sheep & chicken feed trials
- Low input vegetables
- Crop production
- Rotation and pasture management
- · Citrus and fruiting tree orchard

management

· Aquaculture.

Through the Agricultural Show students can also participate in Judging, Paraders and Herdsman competitions.

#### The future in agriculture

Senior students may choose to obtain a Certificate II in Rural Operations or undertake Agricultural Science subjects to contribute to an ATAR.

Downlands is a Gateway School to Agribusiness, assisting the transition to further agricultural studies or work within the Agricultural sector.

Beyond the school gates, the rural program operates a Cattle Show team which supports students to:

- attend and exhibit a variety of cattle breeds at local, regional and major Royal Agricultural Shows and specialist breeder shows
- · compete at Rockhampton Beef Week, held every three years.
- develop and maintain industry partnerships with AgForce, hosting agricultural days and the Moo Baa Munch event at Downlands.
